Int 0197-2002 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the City of

New York, in relation to creating a cause of action against

manufacturers of certain weapons.

Int 0210-2002 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of

New York, in relation to imposing a civil penalty upon the manufacturers of certain weapons illegally used to injure or

kill city employees.

Int 0363-2003 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the City of

New York, in relation to requiring rifle and shotgun owners to

obtain yearly liability insurance.
