- T2003-1160** Oversight - Gun Reform in New York City
- Int 0197-2002** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the City of New York, in relation to creating a cause of action against manufacturers of certain weapons.
- Int 0210-2002** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to imposing a civil penalty upon the manufacturers of certain weapons illegally used to injure or kill city employees.
- Int 0363-2003** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the City of New York, in relation to requiring rifle and shotgun owners to obtain yearly liability insurance.
- Int 0454-2003** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the sale of a rifle or shotgun to anyone under 21 years of age, requiring firearms dealers to collect additional information from ammunition purchasers and enhancing permit information requirements.
Proposed Int. No. 454-A
- Int 0482-2003** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to making it a misdemeanor to trespass upon the playing area of a professional sporting event and imposing a civil penalty for those who interfere with a

professional sporting event.

Proposed Int. No. 482-A

Int 0487-2003 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York in relation to creating a strict liability cause of action against weapons manufacturers.

Int 0536-2003 A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to limiting the acquisition of a firearm to one per ninety-day period.

Proposed Int. No. 536-A

Res 0288-2002 Resolution calling on the United States Congress to pass H.R. 260, which would close the background check loophole at gun shows by extending the Brady law to all sales at gun shows.

Proposed Res. No. 288-A

Res 0289-2002 Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to further restrict the issuance of a license for the possession and purchase of firearms

Proposed Res. No. 289-A

Res 0584-2002 Resolution calling upon the United States Senate to approve S.3096, also known as the "Ballistics, Law Assistance, and Safety Technology Act" ("BLAST Act") to establish a national ballistics fingerprint database.

Proposed Res. No. 584-A

Res 0669-2003 Resolution urging the New York State Assembly to amend A09255 to require that gun owners obtain liability insurance for each firearm owned.

Proposed Res. No. 669-A

Res 1000-2003 Resolution urging the New York State Legislature to limit the acquisition of a firearm to one per ninety-day period.
