










As of May 12th, 2021, there are 27,823 confirmed COVID-19 deaths in New York City. The highest rates of deaths were concentrated in communities of color and within the boroughs of Queens and the Bronx.

Asian or Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander have the highest rate of vaccination among adults in New York City while Black and Latinos are being left behind. Also, Manhattan and Queens have the highest vaccination rate among boroughs in New York.

New York City Employment

As of March 2021, Information, government, financial activities, and education and health services sectors have had minimal job losses. However, leisure & hospitality has lost nearly half the jobs over the past year.

Overall, low & middle wage workers are seeing higher unemployment than high wage workers, except in Queens and the Bronx. Staten Island and Manhattan have seen the greatest loss in low & middle wage workers.

All boroughs have seen big increases in unemployment, but the Bronx is by far worst hit.







As of April 4, 2021, total spending by all consumers in NYC decreased by 2.4 percent compared to January 2020. This only accounts for people using credit/debit cards.

The Accommodation and Food Service industry has been hit the hardest with a loss of 50.7 percent in consumer spending since January of last year. Other industries, such as the Art, Entertainment & Recreation, and the Transportation & Warehousing industries saw losses in consumer spending during the same time period of 36.5 percent and 31.9 percent, respectively.

On the other hand, Grocery and Food Store industry saw a jump of 33.5 percent in consumer spending since January 2020. Other industries such Retail and Health Care and Social Assistance saw a jump in consumer spending of 14.6 percent and 10.3 percent, respectively.



industries all have seen a decrease in job posting during this period.

However, there have been small increases in job postings in the Education & Health Services, and Manufacturing industries.
