Fiscal 2021 Budget Restoration

- One-Time Administration Funding at Adoption. At the urging of the Council, the Administration added approximately \$20.2 million at Adoption of the Fiscal 2021 Plan. This funding is not included in the Fiscal 2022 Preliminary Plan. The funding included:
- \$6.9 million for the Cultural Institution Group (CIG);
- \$12.6 million for Cultural Development Fund (CDF), Covid Relief, Arts Education and Impact Grants;
- o \$446,000 in Energy Grants; and
- \$263,550 in CreateNYC initiatives.
