Proposed Intro 150 would require the creation of a task force regarding the transportation of students in temporary The task force would issue a report housing. assessing barriers to arranging transportation for students in temporary housing and recommendations for addressing those barriers. The task force would also report on any recommendations that are implemented 12 and 24 months after its submission of the initial Proposed Intro 148 would allow youth who have spent time in foster care to eligible for CITYFEPS rental assistance voucher. Any 90 days of the previous two years spent in foster care would count as time spent in shelter for purposes of determining eligibility for the vouchers. Proposed Intro 2405 would allow youth who have spent time in runaway and homeless youth services funded by Department of Youth and Community Development, otherwise known as DYCD to also be eligible for CITYFEPS rental assistance vouchers. We have a responsibility to the young people of the city to insure that whether they are exiting out of a youth shelter or the foster care system, that they are
