bill is sponsored by Council Member Levin. This

Committee heard this Bill at a joint hearing with

Committee on General Welfare on April 16th of this 2 3 year. Students experiencing homelessness and living 4 in temporary housing attend school in every single district in this City. Citywide that is nearly 5 98,000 students for 9.4% of the overall student 6 7 population. Prior to COVID-19 pandemic homeless children and youth already faced many obstacles that 8 hinder them from achieving their full potential. COVID-19 has exacerbated those obstacles and added 10 11 new ones. At our hearing, we heard from applicants, 12 parents and students on the challenges they face 13 every day during this pandemic where appropriate 14 educational spaces within shelters to transportation 15 to access to WiFi they have an internet able computer 16 to engage in remote learning to boost security. 17 These issues and so many more are acutely felt by homeless students. This Introduction amends an 18 19 existing reporting requirement on student health and health services. The data includes information on 20 student based health centers, common student 21 illnesses and health screenings. This Intro will not 2.2 2.3 require such information to be decided by student housing status for students in kindergarten through 24 grade 8 and work with assistant counsel identifying 25
