Chair Cabrera, we are ready to 17 begin. 18 CHAIR FERNANDO CABRERA: Thank you so 19 much Sergeant, thank you for what you do and what 20 everyone on this team has done year after year. So, 21 good afternoon everyone. I am Council Member 2.2 Fernando Cabrera. I am the Chair on Governmental 23 Operations. I want to start off by thanking members 24 of the committee who have joined us today. We've

been joined by Council Member Diaz, Council Member

COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS Louis, Maisel, Council Member Darma Diaz as well, Council Member Kallos, Council Member Yeger, Council Member Powers, Council Member Levin. If I missed anyone, please let me know. Today, the committee will be voting two pieces of legislation. The first is Proposed Introduction number 167B, sponsored by Council Member Alan Maisel. This Bill will require certain agencies to be capable of issuing warnings for first-time violations. As we know, New York City's small businesses have long struggled to remain complaint with many regulations and requirements necessary to lawfully conduct business in the city. Recognizing this fact, certain administrative codes provisions allow the enforcing agency to issue a warning in lieu of a citation for the first time infraction. Agency inspectors are not always able to issue such warning, however, because they lack the necessary equipment. Proposed Introduction number 167B will fix this problem. The Bill will require the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Sanitation and Environmental Protection, and Consumer Affairs and Protection to equip their inspector with devices capable of determining whether a violation, if served in the field is on a first-time violation

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COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS and issuing a warning for such violation if permitted This will ensure that in cases with the administrative code provides a warning, inspectors are actually able to issue those warnings in the manner provided for by the law. The committee previously heard this Bill on Tuesday, October 19th, of 2021 and I am glad to see them moving forward today. The second Bill we are voting on today is Proposed Introduction number 1784A, sponsored by Council Member Farrah Louis. This Bill will require the mayor to establish an office of not for-profit organization services. This new office will serve as a liaison for not for-profits in the city helping navigate city policies, procedures, and regulation and connecting them with city resources and funding opportunities. It would also advise city agencies of measures to improve their programs and processes to better support the not for-profit sector. committee previously heard this legislation October 2019 where we heard from many representatives for the not for-profit sector. We are so grateful for the work these organizations do tirelessly providing critical services to communities throughout the five

boroughs, and with that, I want to thank Council

They are wonderful Bills, and I also want to thank our committee staff, (inaudible), CJ Mary, Sebastian Backy (SP?) for their work on this hearing. Finally, I want to thank my own Legislative Director, Clark Pena for his assistance. I will now turn it over to my colleague, Council Member Farrah Louis to say a few words about her Bill and congratulations again council member. COUNCIL MEMBER FARRAH LOUIS: Thank you so much and good afternoon, Chair Cabrera and members of the committee on Governmental Operations. you for the opportunity to run my voice for my Bill, Intro 1784, that would support one of the most important, yet underrated and under-represented

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of the committee on Governmental Operations. Thank you for the opportunity to run my voice for my Bill, Intro 1784, that would support one of the most important, yet underrated and under-represented industries in our city, which is the non-profit sector. Non-profit organizations across this city provide a vast (inaudible) of services each and every day, and in many cases, they're the life blood of underserved communities like mine. As council members, we allot funding to thousands of organizations to cover the needs of diverse communities ranging from housing, senior services to street cleaning and youth programing. While this

COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS funding is crucial to ensuring thousands of human social service workers employed by these non-profits are paid equitably. It is but a fraction of support that they need to continue providing support services. One of the many challenges that many nonprofit organizations face is balancing their day-today operations while keeping pace with the needs of New Yorkers during their time of need which increases exponentially during the COVID-19 pandemic. As a city, we recognize that running a non-profit organization is never easy and it can be difficult to navigate the checks and balances in place. My Bill, Intro 1784 is intended to provide non-profit organizations with a liaison that can help streamline the budgeting process from allocation to disbursement while bridging communication and information gap between city agencies and organizations working on the ground. By establishing an office of non-profit services within the mayor's office, we are dedicating resources exclusively to provide the support nonprofits need to focus on providing transformative services for our communities. While this is not the end of the plethora of issues that non-profits encounter each and every day, this is a step in the

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right direction towards addressing some of the more prevalent and critical shortcomings within this sector. I hope we can all agree that this will support an essential sector in our communities and that action must be taken now. Thank you again, Chair Cabrera for this opportunity and members of the committee and I hope everyone will support 1784. Thank you.

It's actually a Bill that I 3 4 believe had been introduced in the previous session of council in 2014, although I may be wrong on the dates, and this is exactly what our council should be 6 doing. It's so simple, it's so easy, and it's one of 7 the reasons that I unfortunately, in the view of many 8 of my colleagues have a high number of no votes because I frequently speak about that I will not vote 10 11 a Bill that doesn't provide for the opportunity to 12 give a warning before issuing the penalties. 13 we're actually legislating that where the statutes do provide for the opportunity for warning before 14 15 penalty, we should enable the inspectors to actually do what the statue says, so Council Member Maisel had 16 17 this wise idea many years ago. Today, with just 40 18 or so days to go, we're passing it and I look forward to tomorrow while passing it on the floor to council. 19 20 CHAIR FERNANDO CABRERA: Thank you so much, council member. Those are wonderful words. 21 2.2 appreciate, myself and Council Member Maisel 2.3 appreciate those words.
