SGT. LEONARDO: Thank you. Good morning and welcome to today's remote New York City Council vote for the Committee on Public Safety. At this time will all panelists please turn on their video for verification purposes? Due to minimize disruptions, please place all electronic devices to vibrate or silent mode. Thank you so much. Chair, we are ready to begin.

Morning. I'm Council Member Adrienne Adams of the 28th District in Queens and I'm the Chair of the Committee on Public Safety. I want to thank the members of the Public Safety Committee who are here today, Council Members Holden, Powers, Riley, Brannan and Cabrera for the moment. This morning we'll be voting on proposed Introduction number 1392A in relation to requiring District Attorneys to report on criminal prosecutions. The bill is sponsored by Speaker Corey Johnson and Council Members Levine, Kallos and Rosenthal. Currently, there are no requirements that the City's District Attorney's conduct any public reporting on office function,

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although some local DAs issue periodic reports, there is no uniformity in such reporting and very little data is publically related regarding prosecutorial conduct. As a result, there is a significant lack of transparency regarding prosecutorial decision making in a matter that limits effective oversight of DAs and hinders public trust in the criminal justice Intending to provide increased transparency of procedural decision making this bill requires the City's District Attorney Offices to report on the basic functioning of their offices. These annual reports of which would be posted publically would require each office to release various data points related to decision making at various stages of a criminal case, such as, data on decisions to prosecute or dismiss a case following arrest, bail recommendations and average length of a case before a The report also requires the numbers to disposition. be disaggregated by offense and the race, gender and age of the defendant. This bill would take effect immediately but to permit each of the offices to develop the technological capacities to produce these reports. The first report would not be required until 2024.
