Proposed Reso 976-A, sponsored by the Council member Danny Dromm, which would call on New York City

Comptroller to instruct the pension fund of public employees of New York City to divest from any companies involved in the production and maintenance of nuclear weapons, reaffirming New York City as a

The committee will also be voting on Intro 2454 of which I am the sponsor. This bill would amend New York City's collective bargaining law to allow non-union members to proceed to agreements and arbitration process without union representation so long as the non-union member assumes the costs. This bill would account for the U.S. Supreme Court's decision Janis vs. AFSCME which they declared that unions could no longer collect mandatory their fees-fair share fees to cover the costs of collective bargaining and in the aftermath of the court decision, union leaders feared that more public workers would withdraw from the unions, magnifying the free rider affect where employees can reap the benefits of union bargaining without supporting the union financially. The aim of Intro 2454 is to help ameliorate the free rider affect by removing specific costs associated with services and benefits the public sector unions and what they are required to provide to nonunion members. This will reduce the
