At this time, would all panelists please turn on your video? To minimize disruption, please place electronic devices to vibrate or silent. Thank you for your cooperation. Chair Holden, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON HOLDEN: Thank you. Good afternoon. I am Council member Robert Holden, Chair of the Committee on Technology. I would like to welcome you all to a vote on two bills: proposed Intro 1806-A, a local law would mend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to reporting algorithmic tools used by city agencies and proposed Intro 2158-A, a local law to amend the New York City Charter in relation to designating a geospatial information officer. The first bill by the previous chair of the Committee of Technology, Council member Peter Koo, proposed Intro 1806-A, would increase governmental transparency and encourage accountability by requiring an annual report by agencies on algorithmic tools used by those

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agencies except when such a disclosure would endanger public safety or interfere with an active agency investigation. Such a disclosure would include, among other things, the commercial name, brief description of such algorithmic tool, the vendor name, the purpose of the tool, and the type of data collected and analyzed by it. The second bill is proposed Intro 2158-A, sponsored by Council member Steve Levin, by the request of Manhattan Borough Pres. and soon-to-be Council member Gale Brewer, and also cosponsored by myself. The proposed legislation would require the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications Commissioner to designate an employee to serve as the Chief Geospatial Officer information officer. The bill would also require maintaining and implementing a special data interoperability strategy, including the development of maintenance of a plan for the city's use of geospatial information systems. I would like to recognize my fellow committee members: Council member Yeger, Council member Ulrich, Council member Lander, and Council member Vallone. I would like to thank the staff of the Technology Committee, Irene Bahofsky [sp?] and Charles Kim for their hard work in
