## COMMITTEE ON WOMEN & GENDER EQUITY

A P P E A R A N C E S (CONTINUED)

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Before we move on, I would like to welcome my colleague and predecessor Committee Chair, Council Member Rosenthal, to say a few words on her bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER ROSENTHAL: Thank you so much,

Chair Diaz, uh, I really appreciate you and

appreciate your, uh, committee hearing this bill, and

I urge my colleagues vote yes on it.

Just a quick description. So, according to research, over 50% of people experience street harassment. What this bill does is add the definition of street harassment to our City's administrative code. It, uh, establishes a Street Harassment Committee made up of a broad range of city agencies and nonprofits, to, uhm, examine the issue and included in the membership is, uh, a member of the MTA, hopefully, MTA staff, they're invited to join, the Office of Nightlife is invited to join. And, it is my hope that the Mayor or The City Council will appoint someone from the organization called Hollaback! To join the committee as well. Hollaback! has been the leading voice in New York City to study street harassment, which can be sexual, but is not limited to that. We've seen horrible Asian hate crimes, uh, experienced by people on the street,

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that's street harassment. Uhm, and that's on the rise. The LGBTQI+ Community experiences street harassment in particular, transgender women. And this can be stopped. It can be stopped through education campaigns and bystander training.

Education campaigns can be geared toward both the harasser, the public who might see the harassment, and the victim.

So, enough is enough. This bill requires city government to take street harassment seriously, and I am so proud that, uh, we've been able to move it to this space, and, uhm, appreciate you, Chair Diaz. And, to the committee staff, uh, I see Chloë Rivera is here, uhm, Jai Shree Ganapathy worked on this bill, thank you, Chloë, uh, and Brenda McKinney has worked on this bill. So... And, Jeff Baker, of course, thank you so much for all your help in bringing it to this place.

CHAIRPERSON DIAZ: Thank you. Thank you for breaking down the bill to the greater audience. we're clear, uhm, that there will be as much of New York City involvement as possible. And, when I say New York City, it's the many arms that we have in government, including the MTA. You know, this

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definitely has been an issue in my community, so I'm

3 looking forward to positive resolution, or a good

4 healthy conversation to come. You know, it's much

5 needed; it's healthy conversation. Sometimes

6 conversations of this nature are hard to have, but

the time has risen for us to have this conversation.

I'd like to thank my colleagues, the committee members that at last minute jumped back in. We thought last week we were done, but life said differently. We're New Yorkers, and we know we've got to get these going; we just get them done.

I'd like to thank my staff, Karen Cherry, Chief of Staff [INAUDIBLE 00:5:13] Legislative Director, I'd like to thank Chloë Rivera, and also Brenda McKinney, who my understanding is has worked on this bill, but is out on maternity leave. Uhm, Brenda, if you're out there listening, we thank you for all your efforts, and your efforts have not been forgotten. I would also be remiss if I would not include our Finance Chair, our lead, we know as members and without the union, the financial piece of this, we don't know if we can actually move a bill forward. So, again, thank you for all of you that have participated from beginning to end. [INAUDIBLE
