Hanratty, a lawyer and a CPA who previously worked

Darrin Porcher a Bronx resident and a registered member of 4 the republican party. Mr. Porcher is a retired NYPD Lieutenant who currently teaches criminal justice at 6 7 Pace University and also works as an expert witness and consultant. And finally, Marc Wurzel a Manhattan 8 resident and registered member of the democratic party. Mr. Wurzel is a former counsel to the New 10 11 York City Minority Leader and to the Commissioner of Finance, is currently General Counsel and Assistant 12 13 Secretary to the Grand Central Partnership. 14 Let me briefly explain the functions of the 15 Districting Commission. New York City Charter, 16 Sections 50, 51 and 52 provides for the establishment 17 of a districting commission following each [INAUDIBLE 18 2:37] a commission to be convened to redraw 19 councilmanic district to accurately reflect the 20 city's demographics. Each of the 51 councilmanic 21 districts across the city may increase or decrease in 2.2 size depending on the census data to accommodate 2.3 changes in population. The Districting Commission consists of 15 members, five appointed by the 24

Three members appointed by the majority 4 vote of the council delegation, the second largest 5 delegation republicans and seven members appointed by 6 the Mayor. The party enrollment in the Mayor appointees 7 8 shall be individuals enrolled, the single party do not make up the majority of the total number of members. Commission members serve without 10 11 compensation. The term of the Commission ends upon 12 the adoption of a final redistricting plan. And can 13 we call for a vote now on those three members? 14 Peter, can we call for a vote. 15 COMMITTEE CLERK: Sorry, Council Member Borelli? 16 Am I on mute? 17 MINORITY LEADER BORELLI: No, we hear you. 18 calling for a vote on Kevin Hanratty, Marc Wurzel and 19 Darrin Porcher. 20 COUNCIL MEMBER ARIOLA: Aye. 21 COUNCIL MEMBER CARR: I think he was calling you 2.2 to vote Joe. 2.3 MINORITY LEADER BORELLI: Oh okay, I vote aye. COUNCIL MEMBER PALADINO: Aye. 24
