It is my great privilege to recommend Mr. Michael Goldblum as a commissioner for the Landmarks Preservation Commission. I am a Professor of American Studies at St. John's University and have known Mr. Goldblum for over twenty years. Over the last five years, I have witnessed Mr. Goldblum's exceptional architectural work as a member of Community Board 8 in the northwest Bronx. I am now Vice-Chair of Community Board 8.
