4	the Chair of the Committee on Rules, Privileges
5	and Elections. Before we begin, I would like to
6	introduce the members who are here with us today,
7	who are present. We have Council Member Al Vann,
8	Council Member Leroy Comrie, to my right we have
9	Council Member Lew Fidler, Council Member Karen
10	Koslowitz, Council Member Jimmy Vacca, Council
11	Member Inez Dickens and myself. Today before,
12	before us we have three candidates for review, two
13	candidates for appointment the Landmarks
14	Preservation Commission and one candidate for the
15	appointment to the Taxi and Limousine Commission.
16	They are Michael Goldblum, a Bronx resident, is
17	being considered for appointment, by the Mayor to
18	the LPC. If the Council gives its advice and
19	consent he will replace Steven Burns and serve for
20	the remainder of a three year term that expires on
21	June 28, 2011. Mr. Goldblum is a registered
22	architect. Roberta Washington, a Manhattan
23	resident, is being considered for reappointment by
24	the Mayor to the LPC. If the Council gives its
25	advice and consent, she is eligible to serve for

we go, we have the pronunciation there, sorry about that -- a Bronx resident was recommended by the Council's Bronx delegation for appointment to the Taxi and Limousine Commission. If the Council gives its advice and consent, Mr. Gjonaj will fill a vacancy and be eligible to serve for the remainder of a seven year term that expires on January 31st of 2015. First I'll briefly explain the functions of the Landmarks Preservation Commission. The New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission which consists of eleven members is responsible for establishing and regulating landmarks, portions of landmarks, landmark sites, interior landmarks, scenic landmarks, and historic districts, and also regulates alterations to designated buildings. The Charter requires that the Commission's membership include at least three architects, one historian, qualified in the field, one city

planner or landscape architect, and one realtor. 2 No professional qualifications for the remaining 3 members are delineated in the Charter. 4 5 statute, the Commission's membership must have at least one resident from each of the five boroughs. 6 The Mayor appoints members of the Commission for staggered three year terms, each member continues 9 to serve as a Commissioner until his or her 10 successor is appointed and qualified. The Mayor 11 designates one of the members to serve as Chair of 12 the Commission, and another to serve as Vice 13 Chair. Both of these appointees serve until a successor is designated. Members other than the 14 15 Chair serve without compensation, but are reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred in 16 17 the performance of their duties. The Chair's 18 salary is currently \$192,198. The Commission 19 appoints a full time Executive Director and may 20 employ technical experts and such other employees 21 as may be required to perform its duties. 22 Commission is required to provide opportunities 23 for comment in advance of any hearing on a 24 proposed designation. In addition, the Commission 25 may at any time make recommendations to the City's

qualification of a successor. Vacancies other 2 than those that occur at the expiration of a term 3 shall be filled for the unexpired term. The Mayor 4 5 may remove any such member for cause upon stated 6 charges. The Mayor designates one member of the Commission to act as the Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer. The Chairperson shall have 9 charge of the organization of his or her office, 10 and have authority to employ, assign and superintend the duties of such offices and 11 12 employees as may be necessary to carry out the 13 provisions of the Charter, 65 of the New York City 14 Charter. The Charter provides that the 15 Chairperson's child devote his or her full time to 16 the petition, and as such receive compensation as 17 set by the Mayor. The Chair currently receives a 18 \$192,198 compensation annually. Other members of 19 the TLC are not entitled to compensation. 20 Commissioner is responsible for the continuance, 21 for the continuance, further development and 22 improvement of the Taxi and Limousine Service in 23 the City of New York.
