2	CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Okay. Welcome
3	to today's hearing on the Waterfronts Committee.
4	Good afternoon and welcome. My name is Mike
5	Nelson, I chair this committee. Today we will be
6	voting on Resolution 414-A, calling upon the
7	United States Congress to pass H.R. 5967, which
8	updates the federal motor carrier statute in the
9	Federal Aviation Administration Authority Act of
10	1994 to empower America's ports to implement and
11	enforce innovative environmental solutions for
12	truck pollution, and upon the Port Authority of
13	New York and New Jersey to adopt a comprehensive
14	program modeled after the Los Angeles Clean Truck
15	Program, to ensure the ports of New York and New
16	Jersey are able to reach the highest standards of
17	efficiency, sustainability and safety.
18	Air quality is an important issue
19	for New York City, both because it has a direct
20	influence on residents' health, quality of life
21	and the enjoyment of the City's waterfronts. Poor
22	air quality leads to increased risk of asthma,
23	heart disease and of course all other ailments as
24	well. The emissions from trucks cause acute, and
25	chronic, aversive health effects in human due to

2	the constituents of diesel emissions.
3	Furthermore, pollution emitted from trucks is an
4	important element of the City's contribution to
5	climate changing greenhouse gases, and contributes
6	to our ozone non-attainment status under the Clean
7	Air Act.
8	In 2009, the Port Authority of New
9	York and New Jersey announced their strategy to
10	reduce diesel and greenhouse gas emissions for the
11	port. This strategy includes replacing outdated
12	trucks with a regional truck replacement program.
13	At this time, however, the program is voluntary
14	because the Port Authority lacks the regulatory
15	authority to promulgate rules with respect to
16	environmental standards for trucks.
17	This resolution, 414-A, asks
18	congress to give our nation's ports the authority
19	to clean up their operations. Having said that, I
20	will turn it over to the lead sponsor of this
21	resolution, Brad Lander.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: Thank you,
23	Mr. Chairman. I want to thank you for your
24	leadership on this, both on the bill and the
25	hearing that we had earlier this year on the

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2	burger issue of boundary out a succe and more
2	broader issue of keeping our ports green and more
3	sustainable, and thank Jeff Baker and Colleen
4	Pagter for their work on the broader issue and on
5	this bill, and also Michael Friedman Schnapp
6	[phonetic] on my staff.
7	You know, at the hearing that we
8	had on this we heard from some members of my
9	community, some constituents of mine and some
10	neighbors of other ports around the City and
11	actually around the region talking about the
12	challenges that they're facing in their
13	neighborhood as a result of truck emissions, and
14	very eager to phase out those old polluting
15	trucks. We also heard from some of the currently
16	classified as independent truckers serving the
17	port, three of whom testified before us, making
18	clear that while they have all of the burdens of
19	being classified as independent, of having to pay
20	for their trucks and pay for their insurance, they
21	essentially have none of theirthey're told where
22	to go, they're told what they're picking up, and
23	that they would be much happier under an LA-like
24	program.
25	There's a great bill in congress

2	sponsored by Congressman Nadler that would simply
3	give ports the ability to set environmental
4	standards and to set labor standards in a way that
5	will help our ports move forward, in a way that
6	will make them more sustainable in better places.
7	I'm thrilled with the fact that
8	volumes are increasing in the Port of New York and
9	New Jersey, and give credit to EDC and the Port
10	Authority for their work. We are sure much better
11	off with things coming by ship rather than coming
12	by long haul truck, but as port volumes grow both
13	now and in the future, we've got to do more to
14	make sure that the neighborhoods around them and
15	our City as a whole have the environmental quality
16	and the job quality that we need.
17	So, thank you very much, and I hope
18	my colleagues will join me in voting for this
19	resolution and helping us move forward to get
20	congress to pass the bill.
21	CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Thank you.
22	And with us, of course, is Council Member Gale
23	Brewer, Peter Vallone Jr., and Erich Ulrich.
24	Thank you all for being here. I guess we can go
25	right to the vote? Where is? Oh, thank you,

3	KEVIN PIN: Kevin Pin [phonetic]
4	Committee Clerk. Roll Call on the Committee on
5	Waterfronts. Councilman Nelson.
6	CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Aye.
7	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: I vote Aye,
8	and only wish it was an intro and not a
9	resolution. It's very frustrating to have to take
10	second place to the City of Los Angeles in terms
11	of environment and economic development at the
12	waterfront. I vote Aye.
13	CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Well said.
14	KEVIN PIN: Vallone.
15	COUNCIL MEMBER VALLONE: I am going
16	to take a backseat to no one when it comes to the
17	environment, so I am going to abstain on this to
18	give proponents more of a chance to explain to me
19	why we can't gain the same environmental benefits
20	without a clause which essentially puts the
21	independent American trucker out of business. So,
22	I'm going to abstain and hopefully speak to some
23	people, including the sponsorwho has been
24	working all weekend trying to, well, actually
25	helping to get me to abstain as opposed to voting

2	no. I commend your goals on this and look forward
3	to speaking with you. Thanks.
4	KEVIN PIN: Lander.
5	COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: With thanks
6	to Council Member Vallone for the chance to keep
7	talking about it, I vote Aye.
8	KEVIN PIN: Ulrich.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER ULRICH: Aye.
10	KEVIN PIN: By a vote of four in
11	the affirmative, zero in the negative and one
12	abstention, the item has been adopted. Members,
13	please sign the Committee Report.
14	CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Thank you.
15	Having said that, this hearing is adjourned.
