The first two bills are sponsored by Council Member Feliz and aim to improve the enforcement of self-closing door requirements, which are an important, critical safeguard in preventing the spread of fire and smoke when a building catches fire.

Proposed Introduction Number 104-A, clarifies that self-closing doors must return to the closed position and latch shut. This is a clarification on the definition and is an important one.

Proposed Introduction Number 105-A, reduces the number of days a self-closing door violation must be corrected from 21 days to 14 days, and requires HPD to conduct re-inspection within 20 days afterwards. It also increases penalties for self-closing door violations.

The third bill, Proposed Introduction Number 155-A, sponsored by Council Member Carr, is meant to provide a measure of relief to small property owners

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whose buildings have been damaged by a fire by 3 waiving permit filing fees when they are needed to repair damage caused by a fire or to correct a 4

construction defect discovered after the fire. 5

I am joined to today by my colleagues Council Member Avilés, Council Member Barron, Council Member Hudson, Council Member Kagan, Council Member Schulman, Council Member Carr, Council Member Feliz, Councilwoman Cabán, and Council Member Dinowitz, who is very impressively also chairing a hearing at this time.

And, with that, I want to now turn it over to the bill's sponsors, first to Council Member Feliz and then to Council Member Carr, to speak about their bills.

Council Member Feliz?

COUNCIL MEMBER FELIZ: Thank you so much, Chair Sanchez.

Good afternoon, I am Council Member Oswald Feliz. I proudly represent the 15th district, which is the district that was affected by the unspeakable Twin Parks tragedy.

That tragedy that we saw on that ugly Sunday morning was avoidable. Properly functioning self-

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closing doors would have prevented that unspeakable tragedy in Twin Parks. Had those self-closing doors properly functioned, smoke would not have filled the entire building, and families would have been able to safely escape that tragedy from that fire.

These fire safety bills will help ensure that another similar tragedy never happens again. These bills will ensure that self-closing door laws are scrupulously honored and scrupulously and enforced.

The mandatory inspections and the increased civil penalties will help ensure that violations -- all housing violations -- but specifically on the issue of self-closing doors -- that those violations are taken seriously and they are promptly corrected -- and landlords that fail to do so are also held accountable.

Self-closing door laws are critical tools to fighting fires and are also critical to saving lives. Again, in that Twin Parks tragedy, had those self-closing doors worked -- 17 lives lost due to smoke inhalation -- not one life would have been lost has those self-closing doors worked.

So, I want to thank everyone who helped these bills make it this far, including and especially,

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so I think it's appropriate for the City to
facilitate the rebuilding of homes that are damaged
by fires related to defects as well as those who
discover that they have this defect and now want to
take action to prevent a similar tragedy from
occurring to them. And, if the City has an
opportunity to help small home owners save a little
time and go through a less effort, uh, to safeguard
their homes and their lives than we should do that.

I really appreciate the support of The Speaker,
Minority Leader Borelli and all of his encouragement,
in particular, uh, the leadership of Chair Sanchez
and her team, uh, Committee Counsel, Audrey Son; as
well as Chair Ariolai and Chair Feliz for their
leadership, uh, on this issue in the wake of the
terrible tragedy in Council Member Feliz's district.

So I urge all of my colleagues to vote yes, thank you.
