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Today our committee will be hearing... will be voting on a resolution pursuant to the State Open Meetings Law regarding the videoconferencing for City Council Meetings. First the resolution provides that the Council and its Committees and Subcommittees may use videoconferencing to conduct meetings provided that a quorum is physically present in the same physical location where the public can attend.

A council member can only participle virtually if they are unable to physically present due to extraordinary circumstances as detailed in the resolution.

Second, when council members make use of videoconferencing, the public is allowed to attend the meeting by videoconferencing and participate by videoconferencing if it is a meeting during which the public can participate.

Third, the resolution enables The Speaker to make any and all determinations pursuant to the State Open
