2 CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: Good afternoon.

Welcome to the Subcommittee on Planning,

4 Dispositions and Concessions. I am Council Member

5 Stephen Levin. I am joined today by my two

6 colleagues on the committee, Council Member Peter

7 Koo from Queens and Council Member Inez Dickens

8 from Manhattan.

We have two items on the agenda today. They are both in the Council district represented by Council Member Rosie Mendez, that's Council District 2 in Manhattan Community Board 7. They are: Land Use 175, which is 535-537 East 11th Street, C 100452 HAM and Land Use 176, which is 706-712 East 9th Street, in Manhattan Community Board District 7, Council District 2, C 100453 HAM.

To testify on both of these items, and we'll do them one at a time, is Assistant

Commissioner Carol Clark from HPD. I will just quickly read for Land Use 175. It's an application submitted by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, pursuant to Article 16 of the General Municipal Law for the State of New York, the designation of property located at

535-537 East 11th Street as an Urban Development
Action Area and an Urban Development Action Area
project for such area. Pursuant to Section 197-c
of the New York City Charter for the disposition
of such property to a developer to be selected by
HPD, under the HPD Supportive Housing Loan
Program. It's an eight-story building with
approximately 46 units. Ms. Clark, can you please
fill us in on some of the details? Thank you.

CAROL CLARK: Thank you, Mr.

Chairman and members of the committee. As you noted, LU 175 consists of the proposed disposition of two vacant lots which are located at 535-537

East 11th Street, under HPD's Supportive Housing Loan Program.

The sponsor is the Lower East Side
People's Mutual Housing Association and their goal
is to construct an eight-story building with 45
residential units plus one superintendent unit. A
total of 27 studio apartments will be reserved for
formerly homeless individuals, with the other 18
apartments restricted to low income single adults
from the community. The project will also include
approximately 1,800 square feet of landscaped open

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      space and a multipurpose community room. Council

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      her strong support of the project.

      a little bit about the history of the site?

      Currently it's vacant lots, is that correct?
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                     CAROL CLARK: These are two vacant

      lots, yes.

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      being vacant, was there housing on it in years

      past?
                     CAROL CLARK: I'm not certain of
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      the answer to that question. I can get back to

      you if we do some research. I'm imaging from the
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      location on the Lower East Side that at some point
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      there were buildings on those lots, one would
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      assume.

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      point fell into the possession of the property.

      Is that correct?

                     CAROL CLARK: Yes. More than like

      likely though an in rem transaction, but I can

      follow up on that and get back to you.

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units is up to 60 percent of the AMI, which as you

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      know, for a single individual is $33,264 per year.

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      the hearing on that item is hereby closed, seeing
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      no other questions. Moving on to Land Use 176,
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      I'll pass on reading the description and allow Ms.

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                     CAROL CLARK: Thank you, Mr.

      Chairman. LU 176 consists of the proposed
22
      disposition of one vacant city-owned building
23
      located at 706-712 East 9th Street, again under
24
      HPD's Supportive Housing Loan Program.
25
      sponsor, Phipps Houses, will rehabilitate the
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four-story building and construct a one-story rooftop addition.

When completed, the project will net 44 residential units plus one unit for the superintendent. Thirty-two of these will be studios for formerly homeless individuals with 12 one-bedroom apartments reserved for formerly homes heads of household with children. The project will include approximately 10,000 square feet of community facility space. Council Member Mendez has been briefed and has indicated her strong support of this project as well.

CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: Do any of my colleagues have any questions on this item? I'll share the wealth.

COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: Thank you so much, you're so fair. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

On the formerly homeless heads of household, what will be the range of rents? What is the AMI?

CAROL CLARK: The range of rents on the formerly homeless heads of households, they pay 30 percent of their income. As you know, of the annual income with a project based Section 8 voucher figured in too.

      of the AMI, which is $27,720 a year for a single

      individual and $31,680 a year for a family of two.

      will come through DHS also for those units?
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                     CAROL CLARK: Yes, that's correct,
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      the Department of Homeless Services.
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                     COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: What about
      the remaining units, other than those 12 one-

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                     CAROL CLARK: They're all dealing
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      with supportive housing population.

13	projects were unanimously voted in favor by the
14	local community board.

16	supportive services will be provided by Phipps, is

19	Phipps Houses will partner with University
20	Settlement, which is a local community
21	organization that will provide the supportive
22	services to the tenants and also screen them.
