COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Yes. То everyone's surprise, I do endorse this designation. People start lining up at 6:00 a.m., to get in to get their hot meal at 10:00, and by 1:00 o'clock they also leave with a bag of food. This is one of the many things that Father's Heart ministry does in my district, and they're now doing a

capital campaign to renovate and to keep the

me on a Saturday, come on down, let me know.
