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2	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: I call this
3	meeting to order. This is the New York City
4	Council Committee on Transportation. I welcome
5	you to our meeting. It is Tuesday, December 7 at
6	2:45.

Let me introduce the members of the committee who are here: Gale Brewer, Dan
Garodnick, Oliver Koppell, Darlene Mealy, Ydanis
Rodriguez, Deborah Rose, Vincent Ignizio, Peter
Koo and myself, James Vacca.

Today, on the agenda we have Intro 257-A of 2010, a Local Law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to unlawful sidewalk ATMs. The sponsor of the bill, Councilwoman Diana Reyna is here as well. Councilwoman, would you want to say a couple of words? Councilwoman Reyna.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: I'm going to take Council Member Ignizio's advice and just vote yes, to my colleagues. I want to thank Chairman Vacca for his expeditious view in making this bill a priority for this committee. The introduction of this bill started out as what could be a revocable permit to now being a strict enforcement

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tool that should not be considered as a matter of doing business in the City of New York.

Sidewalk ATMs are an obstruction.

They are not legal. This is going to certainly clarify the language in the Administrative Code where the strengthening of enforcement to be able to identify one city agency that will be in this Introduction of bill, the Department of Transportation, to have full enforcement and consider ATMs unlawful under the Administrative Code in what would be considered public sidewalks. This bill will remove discrepancies and uncertainties that exist regarding the law on unlawful sidewalk ATMs.

Currently, there is no way to monitor an ATM position as well as owners because where they situate them in highly trafficked areas which are scouted for this specific purpose of placing of ATM, which also leads to overcrowding of streets and can present a dangerous effort in providing unsafe environments for customers to come and withdraw money from.

A functioning city must place ATMs strategically throughout its businesses or

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location of existing ATMs. The city streets or
sidewalks are not the appropriate place for them.
This bill will certainly give the full
understanding so that the small business and
property owners understand what their limitations
are. Thank you so much to this committee.

CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Thank you,

Council Member Reyna for your legislation. I

would recommend to all members a yes vote. I will

now proceed to call the roll. Council Member

Brewer?

I do hope that the Department of Transportation as the enforcement agency will go out and educate the property owners and/or stores where there are ATMs outside. I've done a walkthrough with the Department of Consumer Affairs as an education campaign on some of their potential violators and was incredibly successful. I hope that that will be, and I've discussed this with the deputy mayors, more of an education campaign because these fines are very high. I would like to see education before fine. I vote aye. Thank you.

25	Very often, the Council finds these problems in

2	our streets and recognizes them, tries to
3	cultivate and make them into good public policy.
4	This was a way in doing so. My colleague Diana
5	Reyna pointed out the safety impacts and concerns
6	that this has on people who don't know, if they're
7	going to an ATM on the street, who is around them
8	and what security measures are there. I just want
9	to applaud good public policy.
10	I hope that whatever bills come
11	down the pike we do when we address them and we
12	speak to them in this body or in this committee or
13	in any others. But with that, I think we should
14	applaud the day and applaud my colleague Diana
15	Reyna for taking a leadership issue in this and
16	wishing her well. I proudly vote aye.
17	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Thank you,
18	Council Member. Council Member Koo?
19	COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: I vote aye.
20	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: The clerk,
21	please announce the result. I didn't see you,
22	Jimmy. Council Member Van Bramer?

COUNCIL MEMBER VAN BRAMER: Thank you very much, Mr. Chair, from one Jimmy to another. I just want to say that I too want to

2	congratulate Council Member Reyna. I think this
3	bill makes a great deal of sense and is really
4	strong, good public policy. I was proud to be a
5	co-sponsor. With that, I vote aye.
6	COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO: Mr.
7	Chairman, I think it's offensive that he stole my
8	entire congratulations and good public policy, and
9	I just want to note that for the record.
10	COUNCIL MEMBER VAN BRAMER: You
11	said good public policy; I said strong public
12	policy. There's a big different, Council Member
13	Ignizio.
14	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Thank you. For
15	the record, I vote aye as well. Would you please
16	announce the result?
17	WILLIAM MARTIN: William Martin,
18	Committee Clerk, the roll call in the Committee on
19	Transportation stands at ten in the affirmative,
20	zero in the negative and no abstentions. Members,
21	please sign the committee report. Thank you.
22	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: I would like to
23	thank our counsel and our policy analyst: Lyle
24	Frank and Nivardo Lopez. I also would like to
