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CHAIRPERSON HANKS: Good morning. I am Council

Member Kamillah Hanks, Chair of the Committee on

Public Safety and I am joined by my Committee

Members, Council Member Bottcher, De La Rosa, Mealy,

Stevens, Joseph, Ariola, Holden, and Brannan.

Today the Committee will be voting on two pieces of legislation, proposed Introduction number 602-A, sponsored by Speaker Adrienne Adams and proposed Introduction number 518-A, sponsored by Council Member Shaun Abreu. First, proposed Introduction, uh, number 602, defines the boundaries of Times Squares to establish it as a sensitive location where firearm possession is prohibited under New York state law. As discussed, when hearing this legislation last month, New York state legislature recently established a socalled sensitive locations where concealed carry of firearms will be prohibited regardless of whether such individuals possess a valid firearm license.

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In addition to general locations such as schools, government buildings, and places of worship, the state legislation, uh, identified the area commonly known as Times Square, as such determined and identified by the City of New York as one such sensitive location.

Here, the Council is fulfilling the City's obligation under state law by defining the geographic, geographical, uh, boundaries of Times Square. Additionally, legislation directs NYPD to establish rules pertaining to persons with a firearms license who live or work in the Times Square area as ascribed by the bill.

Next, proposed Introduction number 518-A will require the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice in consultation with the NYPD to study and report on the illegal flow of firearms into New York City. I view this as a vital step in comprehensively studying, tracking, and reporting the flow of illegal guns, a step that I believe is necessary to inform this Council on the scope of the issue at hand, to aid in formulating fine-tuned policy solutions, and evaluate the administration's progress on shared goal of stopping the flow of illegal firearms into our city.
