CHAIRPERSON NURSE: [GAVELING IN] [GAVEL SOUND]

Alright, so good morning, everyone, welcome to
The Sanitation Committee. Today I am very pleased to
facilitate The Sanitation Committee's first vote on
bills. I am incredibly thrilled that today we are
voting on four pieces of legislation. These are
reintroductions from the previous session, and I am
proud to be co-prime on all of them.

I want to recognize Council Member Jim Gennaro,

Council Member Marjorie Velázquez, Council Member

Rafael Salamanca, Council Member Julie Menin, Council

Member Eric Botcher, Council Member Amanda Farías,

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and Council Member Kristin Richardson Jordan, as well as, Council Member Chi Ossé.

So, today, the four bills that we are voting on:

Intro 414, requiring The Department of Health to
establish rat mitigation zones. In addition to the
four zones already created, the department would also
report on metrics that are being used to create or
eliminate rat mitigation zones.

Intro 442, uh, sponsored by Council Member Eric Botcher, a bill mandating that before a permit authorizing certain construction work is granted, the applicant certifies that a licensed exterminator was retained to effectively treat the premises for rodent extermination.

Intro 459, sponsored by Council Member Shaun

Abreu, is a bill that allows for the designation of rat mitigation zones by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, uh, by April 2023. And it will require DSNY to set the times buildings must place their garbage and recycling out for collection.

Intro 460 is sponsored by Council Member Shaun

Abreu, is a bill that would require trash receptacles
in buildings identified as having a high

concentration of repeat rodent infestation to be made

of a material or designed to minimize rodent infestation.

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Together these bills represent significant steps towards addressing the rodent crisis in our city. In addition to the existing efforts of the Department of Health, I am grateful for the opportunity to partner with the lead sponsors of the bills. I am also incredibly thankful for the creativity of my Chief of Staff, Mohammad Khan, who created the wonderful rat lobby characters, and who has helped generate significant momentum for the passage of these bills.

I want to thank my Legislative Director, one of the smartest people I know, Annel Hernandez.

And, thank you to the committee task force,

Jessica Albin (sp?), Ricky Chawla (sp?), and Andrew

Lane-Lawless for all of the work you do behind the

scenes.

So, I want to give space for the lead sponsors, if they want to say anything about your bill, I'll let you go first, Council Member Ossé.

COUNCIL MEMBER OSSÉ: We are taking on rats in New York City. And, uh, you know, there's a bill that's in this package that designates rat mitigation zones or more rat mitigation zones. And, I already know

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that there are some areas in our city that we have seen the... the largest and highest rat sightings and rodent populations. So, this bill would make sure that our city is collecting data, and, uh, ensuring that tax payer dollars are actually going towards tackling the rodent population here in New York City. So, this is a step forward. It's not going to solve our furry friends, if we want to call them friends, uh, and fix the problem that exists in our city. However, it's a step in the right direction, and I am really proud to be working under your leadership, Chair Nurse, uh, in terms of really making sure that we're making our city cleaner and safer. So, thank you to everyone that is hopefully going to vote yes on this bill out of hearing. And I'm excited to see this pass.

Council Member Bottcher, did you want to give some remarks?

COUNCIL MEMBER BOTTCHER: I just want to thank and congratulate my colleagues on The Sanitation

Committee, Chair Nurse, and all of you, this has been a very, very productive committee starting back in

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- 2 January with our advocacy right out of the gate to
- 3 get corner basket pick up restored in the budget.
- 4 And now we know that the 3-1-1 calls for overflowing
- 5 baskets are down 55%. And that would not have
- 6 happened without this committee. And today we are
- 7 passing bills to address the rat issue. And I want
- 8 to thank, uh, Manhattan Borough
- 9 president Levine, for partnering with me on the bill.
- 10 | Common sense, if you're building a building, you have
- 11 | to hire an exterminator. And we cannot leave that up
- 12 | to people just to do the right thing. Now you will
- 13 | need a... to certify that you have done it before
- 14 | you get your building permit.
- 15 So, so proud to be here with all of you and part
- 16 of this committee. Thanks, everyone.
