CHAIRPERSON ARIOLA: [GAVEL] Good morning.

I'm Council Member Joann Ariola, Chair to the

Committee on Fire and Emergency Management. I'm

joined by Council Members Holden, Carr, Schulman,

Riley, Yeger, and Feliz.

Today, we are voting on a package of legislation that aims to improve inclusion in the firefighter ranks at the FDNY. These bills will increase transparency and support continued Council oversight as the Fire Department under the leadership of new Commissioner Laura Kavanaugh continues the important work in improving diversity and inclusion in the Department.

We will hear Proposed Introduction 516-a
Introduced by Speaker Adrienne Adams that would
require the FDNY in consultation with the Department

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of Citywide Administrative Services to develop and implement a plan regarding the recruitment and

4 retention of individuals from populations that are

5 under-represented within the rank of firefighter.

Proposed Introduction 519-A introduced by myself would require FDNY to survey and report on permanent facility upgrades at each firehouse that are necessary to facilitate use by a mixed gender workforce. Additionally, the Department would be required, where practical, to implement interim measures including the use physical barriers to accommodate a mixed gender workforce until permanent upgrades can be made.

Proposed Introduction 552-A introduced by Council Member Riley would require the Fire Department to publicly report on demographics of the Department including the number of employees assigned to each Fire Company and Special Operations unit disaggregated by gender and race or ethnicity. The report would also include data on demographics of individuals who reside within the immediate service area of the company.

Proposed Introduction 553-A also introduced by Council Member Riley would require FDNY

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Finally, Introduction 560 introduced by Council Member Nantasha Williams would require the FDNY to submit a public report on complaints filed with the Department's Equal Opportunity Employment Office regarding potential violations in the City's Equal Employment Opportunity policy.

I want to thank the administration and Council staff for all the work they have done in finalizing this legislation.

Before we go to a vote, Council Member Riley, I would like to recognize you to say a few words regarding your bills.

COUNCIL MEMBER RILEY: Thank you, Chair Ariola. It is an honor and a privilege to be here with you all today with my Colleagues in government. With the advocacy that predates my tenure on the New York City Council and the BLAC, I partnered to push this legislative package that will improve the lack

of diversity and inclusion within the FDNY. Speaking to my bills, Intro 522-A and 553-A, Intro 552-A amendments require the annual reporting of demographic information within the Fire Department which encompasses all Fire Companies and Special Operation Units rather than solely just members of the firehouse. This provides further inclusivity to addressing the under-representation of black and brown communities and gender inclusivity with these

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fields.

Intro 553 amendments will ensure our city's Fire Department has the best ongoing diversity, inclusion, and anti-discrimination/anti-harassment training and education that will be in consultation with the Department of Citywide Administrative Services. These bills will also promote accountability by adding testing and proficiency for all employees providing enhanced and in-person training following the violations of these policies and again require that an annual report be posted on its website.

I would like to thank my Colleagues in government for backing this transformative legislation. Thank you to our Bronx Borough
