would require the Department of Education to

distribute information about suicide prevention to

students, including the new 988 Suicide Crisis

Lifeline number, information on suicide warning signs

and risk factors and other related suicide prevention

resources it deems important for students.

The bill would require DOE to distribute this information to all students no later than September 15, 2023, and annually thereafter. The committee previously heard testimony on proposed Intro 610 as part of an oversight hearing this past September. Suicide continues to be a serious problem among young people. It is the second leading cause of death for

- children, adolescents and young adults 15 to 24 years old. Effective suicide prevention is comprehensive and requires a combination of efforts, including teaching people to recognize when they need support
 - Proposed Intro number 610 would connect students experiencing mental health related distress to accessible care and support, which is particularly critical after students experienced two years of isolation during the pandemic. I encourage all of my colleagues to vote yes on this important bill that could help save lives.
