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SERGEANT AT ARMS: Good morning and welcome to today's New York City Council vote on the Committee on Public Safety. At this time, please silence all electronic devices. Chair we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON HANKS: Good morning. My name is

Kamillah Hanks, and I'm the chair on the Committee of

Public Safety. I'd like to welcome you to our vote

today on the proposed Introduction number 759 B,

sponsored by Councilmember Linda Lee. I would also

like to recognize my fellow council members:

Brennan, Ariola, Bottcher, De La Rosa, and Stevens,

and Councilmember Lee, thank you.

COUNCILMEMBER LEE: Thank you so much.

CHAIRPERSON HANKS: This common-sense legislation would require NYPD to provide the public with etchings that affix or engrave identifying numbers onto catalytic converters of vehicles for the purpose of assisting law enforcement investigations and deterring theft of such parts. Additionally, NYPD would be required to conduct public outreach regarding the availability of etchings and the means by which etching may prevent theft of catalytic converters. As New York City continues to experience

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high rates of auto theft and particularly stark
increases in catalytic converter theft, this commonsense legislation will play an important role in
preventing this very type of theft.

I would like to turn it over to Councilmember Lee to deliver a statement about her bill. Councilmember Lee, congratulations.

COUNCILMEMBER LEE: Thank you so much Chair Hanks, and thank you everyone who's on the Public Safety Committee. I'm proud to be introducing this legislation today to combat the exponential rise in catalytic converter thefts. Thefts of these devices have nearly quadrupled in the city this year, leaving victims with \$5,000 to \$10,000 worth of damages to their cars. And this actually happened to one of my staff members as well. Amidst rising inflation and an already difficult economy, New Yorkers should not have to live with this burden. Intro 759 would establish a catalytic converter etching program to distribute VIN etching kits to not only use in new car dealers, but also to the general public. And the bill would invest and expand on the good but overstretched work that the NYPD has already been doing on this issue.

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- So hopefully this bill will be a nice complement to the one that I know that Councilmember Brewer had introduced last session. So thank you so much, and hopefully you can support this bill.
