SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to the Committee on Mental Health, Districts, and Addiction. At this time, we ask that you please silence or vibrate your phone. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LEE: Great. [GAVEL] Good morning, Colleagues. Today, it is my honor to discuss two pieces of disabilities-related legislation.

The first bill, Proposed Intro 681-A would codify New York City At Work, a workforce development program within the Mayor's Office for Persons with Districts, that provides resources and direct support to jobseekers and employers for the purpose of promoting employment to people with districts. This bill would require the Department of Small Business Services, the Mayor's Office of Talent and Workforce Development, and MOPED to maintain an online portal connecting persons with disabilities to employment opportunities and also work individually

in supporting people with disabilities and provide direct support to employers on making accommodations for their workplace.

The next bill, Proposed Intro 682-A, would require the Mayor's Office for People with Districts to collect five-year accessibility plans from each New York City department, office, and agency. These plans would collect information about the accessibility of our city's workplaces, services, programs, and activities and information regarding any ongoing projects and projects planned over the next five years that will help transform our city's facilities and make them more accessible for all New Yorkers.

As a social worker formerly from the nonprofit sector and now as Chair of the Mental Health,
Disabilities, and Addictions Committee, I've seen how
the pandemic has disproportionately affected the
nearly 1 million New Yorkers with disabilities. This
legislation is about making good on the promise of
equal access while helping the city on its economic
road to recovery. I hope that you will all join me in
this fight.
