I'm Shekar Krishnan, Chair of the Committee on Parks and Recreation, and I'd like to welcome all of you to this hearing where we will be voting on three pieces of legislation before the Committee that I am proud to sponsor. Two of the bills relate to improving the efficiency of the Parks' capital process, and one focuses on increasing our City's available green space.

I want to thank all of my Colleagues on the Parks Committee who are cosponsors to this legislation, and we'll proceed to each bill now.

The first bill is Proposed Intro 174-A, which would require the Parks Department to expand its Capital Projects Tracker to include more detailed information regarding its capital projects including the reasons for delays, the date projects were fully funded, the total number of projects in its portfolio, projected and actual cost overruns, individual sources of funding, and the length of time it took to complete each project.

Second is Proposed Intro 842-A, which would require the Parks Department to coordinate with other agencies as appropriate to prepare a strategic document to reduce the duration of capital projects by at least 25 percent. The strategy would review at a minimum early completion incentives, standardization of processes, timelines, and forms, and coordination with utility companies with the goal of lessening the duration of capital projects.

Last, but certainly not least, we'll consider Proposed Intro 680-A, which has been on the Council's radar for years and was a focus of Speaker Adams' State of the City address this past May. This bill would require a city agency or office to conduct a survey of streets with dead-ends located in
