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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a soundcheck for the Committee on Contracts. Today's date is December 21, 2022, being recorded by Danny Huang (phonetic) in the Chambers.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Hello, everyone. Good afternoon. Welcome to today's hybrid New York City Council hearing of the Committee on Contracts. Thank you for your cooperation.

We're ready to begin, Chair.

CHAIRPERSON WON: Thank you so much, everyone. Good afternoon. My name is Julie Won, and I have the privilege of Chairing the Council's Committee on Contracts.

We're here today to vote on a bill I sponsored, Proposed Introduction 136-B, which Proposed Introduction 136-B would require an agency designated by the Mayor to conduct a survey of relevant community-based organizations to assess their capacity to provide translation, interpretation, and other related services. Within one year of the bill's effective date, the agency would need to produce a report detailing the survey's findings and recommend steps to remove barriers facing CBOs in providing such services to the city.

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The report will be submitted to the Speaker and posted publicly on the agency's website.

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Additionally, the agency would need to provide contracting agencies with the names of CBOs participating in the survey, the types of translation, interpretation, and other language services they offer, conduct outreach to CBOs regarding the City's prequalification process including information regarding relevant procurements, and work with contracting agencies to improve the business environment of CBOs seeking to

provide such services to the City.

The impetus for this bill came from complaints my office received regarding large translation service companies outside of New York who are typically unfamiliar with the myriad of nonstandard dialects that are spoken by the City's immigrant communities. As a result, many of those communities rely on informal arrangements with family, friends, or community centers to have critical documents translated and usually with no financial support from the City. The survey would empower the small community-based translators and interpreters by potentially granting them greater

2	access to City contracts. This would support		
3	providers who currently conduct these services often		
4	for free or at personal expense. This report		
5	ultimately improves engagement with government		
6	services for many of the City's immigrant communities		
7	and could provide a lifeline to many informal		
8	translators and interpreters who currently volunteer		
9	their time or conduct this critical work.		
10	Before we begin, I would like to thank		
11	Contract Committee staff, Senior Counsel Alex		
12	Paulenoff, Policy Analyst Alex Yablon, and Finance		
13	Analyst Florentine Kabore for all their hard work
