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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, good morning. Could everyone take a seat, please? Thank you. Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council vote of the Committee on Governmental Operations.

At this time, can everyone please place your phones on silent? Thank you for your cooperation.

CHAIRPERSON UNG: [GAVEL] Good morning.

I'm City Council Member Sandra Ung, Chair of the

Committee on Governmental Operations. I'd like to

Council Members Hanif, Schulman, Brewer, and Brooks
Powers.

At today's hearing, the Committee will be voting a bill sponsored by Council Member BrooksPowers that will provide greater transparency around expenditures made in support of or opposition to municipal ballot proposals or referenda. The Council passed its first Campaign Finance Laws in 1988 and has been regularly improving on this groundbreaking legislation ever since. They have increased the matching rate, lowered contribution limits, and even

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2	candidate, they must disclose where the money came
3	from and include "paid for by" notices on
4	advertisements, but when a Super-PAC spends money on
5	a ballot measure, the PAC is not subject to these
6	requirements. This discrepancy doesn't make sense.
7	Ballot measures have major implications for our city.
8	For example, in 2019, the City adopted rank choice
9	voting in local elections. Last year, voters approved
10	a series of ballot measures in 2022 to support racial
11	justice in New York including the establishment of
12	the Mayor's Office of Racial Equity. Organizations
13	have spent millions to impact voter decisions on the
14	city ballot measures. When big money is spent to
15	influence our elections whether for a candidate or a
16	ballot proposal, the public should know who is
17	spending the money. Disclosure is how we mitigate the
18	impacts of dark money in New York City. That's why
19	today alongside Council Members Farias, Caban, and
20	others, I am co-sponsoring Introduction 855. This
21	bill will make our Campaign Finance Law more
22	consistent and improve transparency and
23	accountability in our elections. I thank my
24	Colleagues for their support, and I look forward to

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2	the passage of this legislation. With that, I ask fo
3	the support of this Committee. Thank you.
