SERGEANT AT ARMS: Good morning. Welcome to the Committee on Civil and Human Rights. At this time we ask if you could please place your phones on vibrate or silent mode. Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON NANTASHA WILLIAMS: (gavel pounding) Happy Black History month everybody. I am Council Member Nantasha Williams, Chair of the Committee on Civil and Human Rights. Thank you to everyone joining us today for our vote on proposed Intro 515-A. On September 22nd, last year we held a joint hearing with the Committee on Civil Service and Labor on pay equity in the municipal workforce and the previous version of the Bill at issue today. We received testimony and feedback from the Equal Employment Practice Commission, the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, the Office of Labor Relations and advocates. Today we will be voting on Proposed Intro 515-A in relation to agency diversity plans, salary data and pay equity analysis. As we

1 COMMITTEE ON CIVIL AND HUMAN RIGHTS 4 2 previously discussed on our hearing this Legislation 3 is a crucial part of the steps we are taking to 4 combat pay and equity, our municipal workforce, one 5 of the largest workforces in the City. We rely on New York City employees to keep this City running but 6 as the Council's Pay Equity Report has repeatedly 7 8 shown women and people of color across our workforce are compensated inequitably. On average they are earning less than their white male counterparts and 10 11 this problem is exacerbated by occupational 12 subrogation. Pay inequity is an insidious problem 13 that we need to attach on multiple fronts. Local Law 18 of 2019 was a first step toward achieving our 14 15 ideals of pay equity. The data we received provided 16 us important content to continue our efforts by 17 highlighting the role of occupational segregation and 18 driving pay disparity. Today we are taking another 19 step down that road. Today, we have an opportunity 20 to step forward in our efforts to achieve greater 21 equity for all New Yorkers. Through this vote we can 2.2 demonstrate how we value our municipal workforce the 2.3 work of our City's women and people of color. Proposed Intro 515-A would require the Administration 24

to analyze how we value work that is largely done by
