Good morning, everyone, and welcome to today's

hearing. My name is Diana Ayala, and I am the Deputy

Speaker of the New York City Council and Chair of the

General Welfare Committee.

Today, our Committee is here to vote on two bills. The first bill, Proposed Intro 92-A which I am a proud sponsor, would create an advisory board for accessibility in our city shelters. People living with disabilities are at a greater risk of entering into homelessness due to discrimination, long-term employment issues, challenges, securing benefits, and so many more barriers. We need to be sure that our shelter system is as accessible as possible for this

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population. We also need to uplift the perspectives of those with lived experience as we create solutions. We have heard anecdotally about shelter residents with disabilities being placed in facilities with no working elevator and therefore have no way to get to their bed. We've heard of facilities where access to electrical outlets is very limited, where bathrooms are inaccessible. My bill will convene an advisory board comprising of those living with disabilities who have experienced or are currently experiencing homelessness as well as city agencies and advocates. It would open up opportunities for dialogue between the necessary stakeholders.

The second bill that we are voting on today, Property Intro 421-A, is sponsored by Council Member Riley and would require the Department of Homeless Services to report on the number of families with children in shelter.

I want to thank the advocates and the individuals with lived experience that have informed and helped us shape this legislation.

Intro 421-A has deepened further data transparency by ensuring reports have truly effective data metrics that seek to provide insight to the needs of some of the most vulnerable New York families with children.

By now proposing for mandated quarterly reporting, we
