19	The Committee previously heard testimony
20	on the bill as part of our oversight hearing on DOE's
21	new admission processes in January. IDNYC is a free
22	identification card available to all New York City
23	residents age 10 and up, regardless of immigration
24	status. With the IDNYC card, students can gain access
25	to a wide variety of city services and can enter city

2	buildings that provide services to the public. Some
З	of the benefits include using the card as a library
4	card and to receive health benefits. Cardholders can
5	also receive benefits and discounts offered by
6	cultural institutions including museums, zoos, and
7	botanical gardens and can gain access to discounts on
8	prescription medicine, fitness, groceries, and New
9	York City attractions. By receiving information on
10	IDNYC, Intro 403A will not only enhance students'
11	high school experience but also better prepare them
12	for the transition into adulthood.
