The Reso was first heard by the Committee at a hearing on social housing on February 23rd. As a co-Sponsor of this Resolution, I expressed my strong support for the creation of a voucher program as a

2 means of keeping families stably housed and

3 preventing homelessness in our city. According to the

4 Coalition for the Homeless, in January of this year,

5 there were roughly 70,000 homeless individuals

6 | sleeping in the City's primary shelter system. Over

7 22,000 of them were children. We know full well that

8 the most cost-effective homeless prevention tool is

9 to keep people securely housed, and vouchers that

10 help families and individuals stay in their homes are

11 | tried and true. The City is experiencing a severe

12 | housing shortage and, even when housing is available,

13 | it is unaffordable to most people. A Housing Access

14 | Voucher program would allow those who are homeless to

15 access homes that would otherwise be unattainable for

16 them and would help families at imminent risk of

17 | homelessness to stay in their homes.

18 I am joined today by Council Members

19 Hudson, Dinowitz, Feliz, Caban, Aviles, Carr, and

20 Shaun Abreu.
