CHAIRPERSON SCHULMAN: [GAVEL] Good morning. I am Council Member Lynn Schulman, Chair of the Committee on Health.

I want to thank you all for joining us this morning.

Today, the Committee on Health is voting on two important pieces of legislation, Proposed Introductions 4A and 675A.

Proposed Intro 4A by Deputy Speaker Ayala would prohibit pet shops in New York City from selling guinea pigs. Importantly, the bill preserves the ability of animal shelters and animal rescue groups to hold guinea pigs for adoption. I'm a proud co-prime Sponsor this legislation. Guinea pigs should be adopted, not sold in pet stores. During the height

of COVID, people bought guinea pigs as pets and then abandoned them in droves when they discovered the significant challenges in taking care of them. As I said, I am proud to be a co-prime Sponsor of today's legislation which will bring relief to overwhelmed animal shelters and help keep these sensitive animals safe. I have a little doll of a guinea pig here. I'm touching this. Most guinea pigs you can't touch. They're very sensitive.

COUNCIL MEMBER ARIOLA: Thank you. On Proposed Intro number 4A, it seems like an overreaction to an increase in guinea pig intakes by shelters during the pandemic when so many people were abandoning pets or giving them up for adoption. This was likely temporary and could be better addressed by an adoption and awareness campaign rather than an outright ban. Therefore, I am a no on Proposed Intro 4A and aye on all the rest.
