Department of Education to carry out instruction in 2 3 bicycle safety in all New York City schools. 4 The Committee previously heard testimony on Intro. 644, 725, and 868 as part of a March 29th 5 hearing on legislation and Resolution 129 at our 6 7 January 25th hearing on DOE's admissions process. I encourage all of my Colleagues to vote 8 9 yes on this important bill as each piece of legislation hopes to ensure that students are 10 11 provided with the resources and support they need to 12 thrive.
