joining me for today's vote on Intro. 209A sponsored by Council Member Shaun Abreu. This bill would prohibit discrimination on the basis of a person's height or weight in employment, housing, and public accommodations. It contains exemptions for employers that need to consider height or weight in employment decisions where required by federal, state, or local laws or when these considerations must be made because height or weight may prevent a person from

performing essential requirements of a job and there 3 is no alternative available.

The Committee first heard this bill in February and received moving and powerful testimony about the hardships endured by those who have dealt with appearance-based discrimination. This testimony along with feedback we've received from stakeholders has informed changes made to the original bill. Preconceived notions and stereotypes surrounding someone's abilities or value based on their height or weight is not only unfair but can also be incredibly harmful to a person's dignity and sense of selfworth.

One of my goals as Chair of this Committee is to make New York City as equitable for everyone as possible. Equal access and opportunity should exist for all regardless of appearance. I look forward to taking another step toward that goal with Intro. 209A, and I'm excited to see the ways in which it will benefit New Yorkers.

As always, I'd like to thank Committee Staff and my Staff for their work leading up to this vote.
