Housing and Maintenance Code by failing to provide

This bill relates to the strengthening of the code enforcement related to heat and hot water violations. The bill provides that a homeowner may be subject to a higher civil penalty of \$500 through \$1,000 for subsequent violations of the central heating requirements. The minimum indoor temperature requirements during the heat season also apply. Hot water requirements or in buildings without a central heat system, the standards for the use of a gasfueled, electric, space or water heaters. This new fine applies to buildings that occur within

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two consecutive calendar years or with respect to violations that violate the minimum indoor temperature requirements that occurred during two consecutive periods of October 1 through May 31<sup>st</sup> which constitutes New York City's heat season.

Following our initial hearing on this bill the bill was amended in the following respects. In addition to some technical changes, Bill Section 2 would now create a new defense for certain subsequent violations of the heat and hot water requirements and this new defense will allow a homeowner to show where violations occurred in second calendar years or heat seasons, documentation of prompt and diligent efforts to correct these conditions that give rise to the initial violation and the conditions were corrected by said homeowner. Where the landlord is successful in making such demonstration the court may impose the lower penalty of \$250 to \$500 rather than the penalty within the higher range of \$500 to \$1,000 for subsequent violations which such bill will now enable. However this new defense may not be used where the initial and subsequent violations occur during the same heat
