Today, the Committee will both hear and 15 vote on one piece of legislation as well as vote on a second piece of legislation, Reso. 550 sponsored by 16 17 Council Member Hanif, a resolution recognizing May as 18 Lupus Awareness Month in the City of New York and 19 Intro. 590A co-sponsored by Council Members Rivera 20 and myself regarding Open Culture 2.0. 21 Now, I would like to welcome Council 22 Member Hanif to provide remarks on her legislation 23 which the Committee is hearing for the first time 24 today. 3 Chair Osse, for including Resolution 550 on today's

This resolution, which I was proud to 5 introduce alongside Bronx Borough President Vanessa 6 7 Gibson would establish May as Lupus Awareness Month. 8 My journey in getting diagnosed with lupus was 9 extremely challenging as a first-generation young woman of color, I was only 17, daughter of 10 11 Bangladeshi Muslim immigrants paired with the 12 inequities in our healthcare system. My hope is that 13 by designating May as Lupus Awareness Month, more people in our city will keep their eye out for this 14 15 complicated disease and get diagnosed and treated and 16 know that this city is rooted in care for us, that it 17 won't leave us behind. This is particularly important for women of color and black women who are 18 19 disproportionately affected. I also want to highlight 20 the policy changes that people with lupus need to 21 thrive in New York City. We need a fully ADA-2.2 accessible transit system, remote work 23 accommodations, and free public healthcare. The fight for a city that prioritizes disability justice 24

Thank you. 4 CHAIRPERSON OSSE: Thank you, Council Member. 5 Now, I would like to read a statement 6 7 from Council Member Rivera to speak about her 8 legislation, which I'm happy to co-sponsor. I know 9 how important this is to the arts and cultural organizations that this Committee is proud to work 10 11 closely with almost every day. A permanent Open 12 Culture program will ensure that our cultural 13 organizations have access to more performance spaces 14 and will expand access to arts and culture to more 15 parts of the city, especially in areas that are 16 considered cultural deserts. I thank Council Member 17 Rivera and her team for championing this critical 18 piece of legislation for our cultural community. 19 Council Member Rivera wrote "Good 20 morning. Thank you to Chair Osse for allowing me to 21 make short remarks regarding my bill we're voting on 2.2 today that would revive and make permanent the Open 23 Culture program that was a lifeline for arts and culture organizations through the height of the 24 pandemic. The legislation would codify the Open 25

There will be a 25-dollar application fee, and there is no cost for the permit. The arts are our 5 City's lifeblood, something evident in the vibrant 6 7 and creative communities of District 2 on the East 8 Side. The arts and entertainment sector were hardest 9 hit by the COVID-19 pandemic," maybe I should let her read her statement. 10 11 COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: No, you can read 12 it. CHAIRPERSON OSSE: You sure? 13 14 COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: Yes. 15 CHAIRPERSON OSSE: Okay. "And are arguably 16 our City's great economic driver. The Open Culture 17 program will help ensure equity and access to the 18 arts, providing a low-barrier way to bring 19 performances and creations outside of buildings and 20 into communities. I encourage my Colleagues to vote 21 yes, and I look forward to passing this legislation 2.2 tomorrow at our Stated Meeting." 23 Council Member Rivera, would you like to add anything to your statement? 24 25

This is how we make arts and culture more accessible, more affordable, and I'm 8 9 very, very excited to see this in the streets. Thank 10 you. 11 CHAIRPERSON OSSE: Thank you, Council 12 Member. 13 I would also like to recognize the 14 Committee Members who are present for today's hearing 15 and vote. We have Council Member Joseph, Council 16 Member Louis, Council Member Hanif, Council Member 17 Ung, and Council Member Hudson. 18 Finally, I would like to thank my Staff 19 as well as the Committee Staff and others who worked 20 on preparing this legislation. Since there is no Administration 21 2.2 testimony today, I will now pass it on to my 23 Committee Counsel to call any witnesses who are present for the public testimony portion of this 24 hearing.
