This version creates a distinction for safety net hospitals and allows for a more vigorous study of their financial crisis. It will also provide a more comprehensive reporting of multiple factors impacting health care costs as a whole.

COUNCIL MEMBER MENIN: Thank you so much, Chair

Narcisse, and I really want to thank you and your

staff for your tremendous support of this bill. I am

so excited to be voting on this bill. This has been

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| 2 | real labor of love. This bill, The Consumer |
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| 3 | Protection and Health Care Accountability Act, is |
| 4 | going to mean that we are creating the first in the |
| 5 | nation Office on Health Care Accountability. And |
| 6 | basically, this office is going to have a website |
| 7 | that discloses, by medical procedure, by hospital |
| 8 | what patients are being charged. It is also going to |
| 9 | assess the amount of money that New York City is |
| 10 | spending on health care. Right now, there is no |
| 11 | other industry where as a consumer you're procuring a |
| 12 | service and you have absolutely no idea what you're |
| 13 | going to be charged for that service. So, if you are |
| 14 | a woman having a C-section in New York City and you |
| 15 | go to Montefiore, you're going to get a bill for |
| 16 | \$55,000. If you go to another New York City |
| 17 | hospital, you will be charged \$17,000. And that is |
| 18 | the case for so many different medical procedures. |
| 19 | Also, this bill is going to allow New York City |

Also, this bill is going to allow New York City to save potentially up to \$2 billion based on studies on this bill. So, specifically, New York City is spending \$11 billion on public sector employee retiree independent health care, that is double what we spent five years ago. And, so, we cannot continue to sustain these skyrocketing health care costs. So,

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this will allow us to harness our purchasing power to

drive down costs. I really want to thank Chair Narcisse; I want to

thank the 41 council members who signed on; I want to thank our phenomenal Labor Coalition who has worked on this bill. Uh, we've got really just a tremendous coalition.

And, also, I want to say one word about Resolution 512 that we are voting on, which calls on the state to create a independent commission to oversee hospital pricing and to increase access to services, because in 1996, Governor Pataki deregulated hospitals. We need to go back and really increase the regulation, and that is what Reso 512 would do.

Finally, I want to thank the many people who helped to draft this bill, because this was a bear of a bill, and I am so thrilled that we are now at the finish line.
