2	SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a sound check
3	for the Committee on General Welfare. Today's date is
4	June 7, 2023. Being recorded by Danny Huang
5	(phonetic) on the 14th Floor Hearing Room.
6	CHAIRPERSON AYALA: Good morning,
7	everyone, [GAVEL] and welcome to today's hearing. My
8	name is Diana Ayala, and I am the Deputy Speaker of
9	the New York City Council and the Chair of the
10	General Welfare Committee.
11	Today, our Committee will be hearing
12	Proposed Intro. 561A sponsored by Council Members
13	Hudson and Rivera. The bill will authorize the City
14	to establish or fund one or more pilot programs to
15	provide direct cash to certain eligible low-income
16	individuals. Poverty in New York City is well above
17	the national average. We know how difficult it is to
18	make ends meet in New York City. Even before the
19	pandemic, half of our City's population lived below
20	the poverty line. The economic pressures of the
21	pandemic could have pushed New Yorkers even further
22	into poverty, but, thankfully, government at every
23	level stepped up to strengthen the safety net,
24	preventing disasters from occurring for many
25	individuals and families. That pandemic support,

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which was intended to be temporary, is quickly coming 2 to an end. What we saw with the pandemic are our 3 4 policies including expansion to unemployment 5 insurance, SNAP, and the Child Tax Credit, is that anti-poverty tools do work. It is with this in mind 6 7 that we are hearing Intro. 561A which would support 8 New Yorkers by authorizing the City to establish a 9 pilot program for the provision of unconditional direct cash payments. I was looking forward to 10 11 hearing from the Administration and the advocates 12 today, but the Administration has informed us that 13 they were not able to send anyone to come in and 14 testify today, and we have been joined by Council 15 Member Ung.

16 With that, I guess I'll just share 17 there's no one testifying online either, but I would 18 like to thank my Colleagues for introducing this 19 legislation. I think that it is important 20 legislation, and I think it's something that's worth 21 taking a look at to explore ways of implementing 2.2 something like this. The poverty rate in my District 23 I know has been really low for a very long time. As a matter of fact, I represent the South Bronx which has 24 been known to be the poorest Congressional District, 25

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2	and that was very evident during the pandemic where
3	we saw lines and lines of family members waiting for
4	three and four hours in a line to receive a box of
5	food just to be able to have something to feed their
6	families with and so programs like this cannot be
7	understated. I think that any support that we are
8	able to lend families to allow them to make ends meet
9	alleviates stress, alleviates burdens on a person's
10	mental health, and I am fully supportive of that.
11	With that, seeing as how there is no one
12	here to testify, this hearing is closed. Thank you.
