Today, the Public Safety Committee will be voting on legislation that aims to assist the City's efforts in addressing the ongoing proliferation of unlicensed smoke shops.

Introduction 1001 sponsored by Council Member Lynn Schulman will prohibit owners of...

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Council Member Mealy, I believe you're unmuted.

CHAIRPERSON HANKS: Council Member Caban is also joining us.

Again, sponsored by Council Member Lynn
Schulman will prohibit owners of commercial premises
from knowingly leasing a commercial premise to
unlicensed sellers of cigarettes, electronic
cigarettes, tobacco products, or illicit cannabis.
The legislation will also require a quarterly
reporting on enforcement relating to such unlicensed
sellers.

Council Member Schulman has asked me to read her opening statement so.

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"As many of you know, we have seen a
proliferation of illegal weed shops throughout the
City. These shops are unregulated. They're selling
adulterated products and selling to minors and
evading sales tax, and they are oversaturating the
market for legal cannabis shops, many of whom who are
impacted by the prohibition of cannabis make it
nearly impossible for the legal shops to flourish.
That is why I'm extremely proud that the Council will
be voting on Intro. 1001 this afternoon which will
create a penalty structure to hold landlords
accountable for leasing commercial premises to
illegal businesses such as unlicensed weed shops and
e-vaping shops. Landlords will receive a warning on
the first offense and, upon a second inspection, it's
determined that the business is still operating in
the commercial premise, the landlord will be issued a
fine of 5,000 dollars and a 10,000 dollar fine for
each subsequent offense. Our hope is that this
legislation will incentivize landlords to do the
right thing and keep our communities safe by only
leasing commercial space to legal licensed
businesses. I want to thank the Public Safety Chair,
Kamillah Hanks, for holding today's vote. Speaker
