2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a microphone 3 check for the Committee on Finance, recorded on June 30, 2023, in the City Hall Chambers by Giselle 4 5 Rivera. 6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and 7 welcome to the Committee on Finance. 8 At this time, we ask if you could please 9 place phones on vibrate or silent mode. Thank you. Chair, we are ready to begin. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: [GAVEL] Okay, good 12 morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee 13 meeting where we will be adopting the FY 2024 budget. 14 I'm Justin L. Brannan, Council Member, 15 and I Chair the Committee on Finance. 16 I want to acknowledge my fellow Council 17 Members who are here today. Council Members Louis, 18 Barron, Stevens, Brooks-Powers, Velazquez, Farias, 19 Hudson, Won, Brewer, Ayala, Osse, Powers, Sanchez, 20 and Moya is on Zoom. 21 Today, the Finance Committee will take 22 the necessary actions for the City Council to adopt a 23 107.1-billion-dollar budget for FY 2024. I first want 24 to thank Speaker Adams for her leadership throughout 25 the entire budget process and particularly through

2	these last six months. The Speaker's commitment to a
3	budget that provides the necessary investments into
4	the essential services that New Yorkers rely on while
5	also preparing for future risks embodies the
6	leadership the people of the City sent us here to
7	achieve. I'd also like to thank the Speaker for her
8	continued commitment to high standards of
9	transparency and inclusivity of all the Members
10	throughout the budget process.
11	I also must thank the tireless work and
12	acknowledge the tireless work of the Council's

Finance Division from preliminary through executive 13 to today, it has been months of very long hours, 14 15 questions from Members, regular briefings, 16 presentations, and reports, and there's so much work 17 that goes on behind the scenes back at mission 18 control across the street. This budget really 19 reflects your dedication, and we really, really 20 greatly appreciate it so thank you to all the Finance Staff, to all of the Financial Analysts, the 21 Economists, the Administrative Support Staff who got 2.2 23 us to this vote today. A very special thank you to the Finance Division's Leadership Team who 24 25 spearheaded this effort, Finance Director Richard

2 Lee, Managing Director Jonathan Rosenberg, Deputy 3 Director and Chief Economist Dr. Ray Majewski, who 4 we'll talk about more later, Deputy Director Emre 5 Edev, Chima Obichere, Paul Scimone, Eisha Wright, Assistant Directors Crilhien Francisco and Elizabeth 6 7 Hoffman, Supervising Economist Paul Sturm, Unit Heads Aliya Ali, Julia Haramis, James Reyes, Jack Storey, 8 9 and Finance Counsel Kathleen Ahn. Of course, a huge thank you to Finance Division's Chief Financial 10 11 Officer and Deputy Chief-of-Staff to the Speaker 12 Tanisha Edwards for her leadership. The budget 13 success we have achieved today is possible from the dedicated efforts of you and the Staff so we thank 14 15 you all.

I would be remiss if I also did not thank 16 17 the Legislative Documents Unit. Today is like 18 Christmas Day for the LDU. They pull it all together 19 through countless emails and changes and corrections 20 and last minute requests from Central Staff that come 21 from Members every hearing, every vote, every 2.2 Stated. Thank you to Jonathan Ettricks, Ruthie Del 23 Franco, Ivette Molina, Billy Martin, and Matthew DiStefano. 24

The ever-present Sergeants-at-Arms who keep things orderly and safe on both sides of the street during budget season, parade season, everything in between. Thank you, Carl, Rafael, and your entire team.

Last but not least, a special shout-out
to my Staff for all that you do, in particular my
Special Advisor Jonathan Yedin and my right-hand man
through all of these hearings Committee Counsel
Michael Twomey.

12 This budget represents the Council's 13 commitment to preserving the key services New Yorkers 14 as a people, as a city rely on to meet the challenges 15 ahead. While decisions have to be made, there is no 16 reason to cut with a scythe in a 107-billion-dollar 17 budget. As just an example of the restorations we've 18 accomplished, we've successfully restored 36.2 19 million dollars in programmatic cuts to our 20 libraries, secured 16 million dollars for Promise NYC 21 childcare services, and implemented a 15-million-2.2 dollar baseline pilot to convert 1,800 school-day, 23 school-year, 3K seats to extended-day, extended year. On housing, the Council restored 32.9 24 25 million dollars to NYCHA's Vacant Unit Readiness

2	program to get vacant apartments ready for new
3	tenants as well as reach the target of 4 billion
4	dollars in capital funds for the construction of new
5	affordable housing. These are anchors around which
6	communities can build and grow their quality of life.
7	We approached this budget with eyes wide
8	open to potential difficulties in the out-years but
9	with the knowledge that resilience doesn't happen by
10	accident. It requires meaningful investments. With
11	the investments secured in this budget, the City has
12	a solid foundation from which to continue to recover,
13	succeed, and be healthy and safe.
14	Now, let's turn to adopting this budget.
15	Before we get to the vote, I'd like to discuss the
16	specific items that we will vote on today. All
16 17	specific items that we will vote on today. All Members received a budget packet by the Committee
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17 18 19 20 21 22 23	Members received a budget packet by the Committee Counsel that contains all the budget-related legislation that must be voted on by the Committee and again by the full Council at the Stated Meeting later today. I'm just going to list the items that are on our agenda that require a vote in this Committee.

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 8 Number two is a resolution approving the 2 3 FY 2024 contract bureau. 4 Number three is a resolution approving the FY 2024 capital budget, which is Reso. A and 5 Reso. B. 6 7 Number four is a resolution approving an expense budget modification which would close out FY 8 2023. 9 10 Number five is a resolution approving a 11 revenue budget modification which closes out FY 2023. 12 Number six is a resolution approving the proposed FY 2024 Community Development Program 13 14 reallocation of the 49th Year Funds and proposed 50th 15 Year Program. 16 Number seven is three property tax 17 resolutions, current base proportion, adjusted base 18 proportion, and the resolution fixing the tax rates. 19 All are interlocking resolutions that together are 20 necessary for adopting the FY 2024 property tax 21 rates. As well as a transparency resolution, the 2.2 23 other documents which do not require a separate vote are Schedule C, a list of the terms and conditions 24 adopted for FY 2024, and that's it. 25

As a reminder to Members, Schedule C is a schedule of the expense and contract budgets and the appropriations for the organizations listed in Schedule C are funded by the expense and contract budgets.

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7 Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict 8 9 exists with any of the groups listed in Schedule C or Reso. A, which details the designations of the 10 11 capital discretionary funds. A separate disclosure 12 form must be completed for the transparency 13 resolution. If any Council Member has a potential 14 conflict of interest with any of the organizations 15 included, they have the opportunity to disclose the 16 conflict at the time of their vote. If you have not 17 signed those disclosure forms yet, Staff from the 18 General Counsel's office are here today and available 19 to guide you through the process. Please contact one 20 of them before you vote.

As a further reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with the proposed subcontractors that are used by any of the organizations sponsored. These disclosures must be

2 made before the subcontractor can be approved to 3 receive funds.

Those are all of our items for today. Are
there any questions or comments from the Committee?
Council Member Barron.

7 COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I want to make a 8 comment just regarding the budget. I just want the 9 public to know that this budget was just given to us 10 minutes ago. This is the final budget that we 10 11 received 10 minutes ago. What they should've attached 12 to it was speedreading so we can get through the 13 budget and make an intelligent assessment of this 14 budget.

15 I also want to say that a budget is a 16 document not just about dollars and cents, but it is 17 about your values, your priorities. This budget does 18 not value the low-income, poor communities of East 19 New York, Brownsville, Harlem, and the Bronx, black 20 and brown communities that are suffering from double 21 digit poverty, double digit unemployment. How do you have a 107-billion-dollar budget and when you look at 2.2 23 that budget, you got 3 billion dollars' worth of cuts and then we're going to celebrate the restoration of 24 200 to 300 million out of the 3-billion-dollar cuts. 25

2	Cuts to education, millions. Cuts to healthcare, cuts
3	to our youth, our seniors. Even we tried to get some
4	fair transportation, didn't want to fully fund that
5	for low-income people. This budget is anti-working-
6	class people. While there was some progress made, the
7	City Council fought to put some things back, but
8	we're dealing with a Mayor who's a not-so-closet
9	Republican conservative cop Mayor that values these
10	things more than the people of our city.
11	I finally want to say that I'll
12	definitely be voting no for this budget. We should
13	use the power of the City Council to say we're going
14	to check this Mayor. I know this budget is no good
15	because I never saw a more reluctant handshake by a
16	Speaker in all my 14 years in doing this budget. I've
17	never seen such a reluctant handshake, but, because
18	they have to work together, that front has to be put
19	up. We shook hands on this yesterday, not we, not me,
20	they shook hands on this yesterday before they even
21	saw it. We just got the final budget today so for the
22	people of New York City, you need to rise up, you
23	need to rise up and take a strong stance on how your
24	tax-paying dollars are being spent and used. The fact
25	that you're not the priority. I want to enc the

2 Council to vote no on this budget until they do it 3 right by the people of New York.

4 I want to say also 439 million dollars should have been added or put into this budget, set 5 aside for our retirees. These are people who worked 6 7 in our schools, lunchroom attendants, who made sure that our children could cross the streets, traffic 8 9 safety officers. These are people who did the essential service, EMS, sanitation, and you, Mayor 10 11 Adams, you don't want to pay 439 million that the 12 City has been paying for 57 years, you want to force 13 them into Aetna who took our policies for enslaved 14 Africans, who is under investigation for corruption, 15 and who doesn't unionize, but all these unions were 16 with the non-unionizing Aetna. I say keep them in 17 Senior Care because we need to care for those 18 retirees.

I will be voting no on this budget
because, as Adam Clayton Powell said who sat three
seats over to my right, he was the first black
Council Member in this District, and he said use
what's in your hands. If you have power in your
hands, use it for the people of New York City. Use it
so that we can have a more humane sensitive budget.

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 13 This budget is not fiscally prudent. It's fiscally 2 3 negligent and economically oppressive to the poor working-class families of New York. I will be proudly 4 5 voting no on this budget. CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you, Council 6 7 Member Barron. Are there other comments or questions 8 from the Committee? 9 We've also been joined by Council Members 10 Hanks and Carr. 11 12 If there are no more questions or 13 comments, I'm going to ask Billy Martin, the Committee Clerk, to call the roll. 14 15 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Good 16 afternoon. William Martin, Committee Clerk. Roll call 17 vote Committee on Finance. All items are coupled. Chair Brannan. 18 19 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: I vote aye. 20 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Ayala. COUNCIL MEMBER AYALA: I vote aye. 21 2.2 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Moya. 23 COUNCIL MEMBER AYALA: I have to disclose. I'm sorry. 24 25

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2 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Hang on. Council3 Member Ayala has to make a disclosure.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Sure.

5 COUNCIL MEMBER AYALA: I am disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings that one, AHRC, 6 7 the New York City Chapter of the New York City Association for the Help of Retarded Children, which 8 9 I take offense to that name, is funded in the budget that we are adopting, and my partner is an employee 10 11 of that organization and that, two, Positive 12 Workforce is funded in this budget that we are 13 adopting and my son and my brother are associated 14 with that organization. Thank you. 15 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 16 you. Council Member Moya. 17 COUNCIL MEMBER MOYA: I vote aye. 18 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 19 you. Powers. 20 COUNCIL MEMBER POWERS: I vote aye, and 21 I'm disclosing on the record of the Council 2.2 proceedings that Mount Sinai Hospital is funded in 23 the budget we are adopting. My mother is an employee of the organization. 24 25

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2 Chair, just a quick second of your3 indulgence.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Yes.

COUNCIL MEMBER POWERS: Thank you. I just 5 want to congratulate Chair Brannan, the Finance 6 7 Division, the Speaker, and many others for a very hard-fought negotiation here, and, after months of 8 9 doing hearings and fighting to get restorations, which are a big deal. I want to congratulate them. I 10 11 want to say a very big congratulations to Richard Lee, Tanisha, and the whole Finance Division here for 12 13 the work they did, and I'm very happy to see our 14 libraries, our cultural institutions, and many others 15 that are getting the restorations they rightfully 16 deserve, and I hope we will continue to fight for 17 them in the future, and I know we will, and to see 18 many of the other great victories here as well. 19 I proudly vote aye. 20 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 21 you. Louis. 2.2 COUNCIL MEMBER LOUIS: I would like to 23 disclose on the record of the Council proceedings that Metropolitan Transportation Authority is funded 24 25

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 16 in the budget that we're adopting today and my 2 3 brother is an employee with the entity. I would also like to echo the same 4 sentiments as Majority Leader Powers. I want to 5 congratulate you, Chair Brannan, on your hard work as 6 7 well as the Finance Division, Tanisha, Richard, and 8 everyone else. 9 I vote aye on all. COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Brooks-10 11 Powers. COUNCIL MEMBER BROOKS-POWERS: Permission 12 13 to explain my vote. 14 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Sure. 15 COUNCIL MEMBER BROOKS-POWERS: First, I'd like to commend you, Chair Brannan, as well as 16 17 Speaker Adams for leading this Body through a very 18 difficult budget year, recognizing that the Mayor has 19 made significant cuts to critical services for New 20 Yorkers, and while we may not have been able to make every line item come back, we were able to hold the 21 line in the sand for a number of critical areas 2.2 23 including for our seniors, including for our education system, including for public 24 25 transportation, and I just want to remind everyone

2 that the budget in the City Council is a year-round 3 process, and we look forward to exercising our full 4 oversight responsibilities over the course of the 5 year.

With that, I would like to disclose on 6 7 record of the Council proceedings that Queens Alumni Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated 8 9 is funded in the budget we are adopting, and I am associated with that organization, and that Greater 10 Allen AME Cathedral of New York is funded in the 11 12 budget we are adopting, and I am associated with that 13 entity, and that Edge School of the Arts, also known 14 as ESOTA, is funded in the budget we are adopting, 15 and my daughter is associated with that organization. 16 With that, I vote aye. 17 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you. 18 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 19 you. Barron. 20 COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Just want to 21 disclose that my son works for BRIC, which is funded 2.2 in this budget. He's an employee of that entity. 23 As I vote no on items M141, no on M142, and no on M143, which is basically the budget, I vote 24 25 no on that and just want to remind also that when

2	they talk about 36 million being restored to the
3	libraries, that's a good thing, but they're restoring
4	it on top of cuts from last year so that 36 million
5	doesn't even make the libraries whole because they
6	had to do cuts last year, 3 and 4 percent, and cuts
7	this year, and so they play this little fake fight
8	game and restore stuff that they cut it and didn't
9	make them whole this year so I vote no and aye on all
10	the other items.
11	COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank
12	you. Brewer.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Thank you. I
14	definitely vote yes. Like everyone, I want to thank
15	the Speaker and Chair Brannan. I also want to thank,
16	obviously, Richard Lee, Tanisha Edwards, Johnathan
17	Rosenberg, Vanessa Diaz, all the MDI Staff with Jimmy
18	Reyes (phonetic), Carolyn Gill, and Owen Kotowski
19	(phonetic) and Cynthia Hornig, Shula <u>(INAUDIBLE)</u> and
20	Sam Goldsmith from my office. A very tough budget. I
21	want to second the comments that we're going to keep
22	working on it during the year, particularly for
23	those, we worked as hard as we could for the human
24	service employees for whom I have great respect. We
25	obviously need to try to get COLAs to be increased,
I	

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 19 but it was hard-fought, and the Mayor cuts the 2 3 workers who are the backbone of our city. Thank you very much, everyone involved. 4 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 5 you. Farias. 6 7 COUNCIL MEMBER FARIAS: I'm disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings that NYU 8 9 Langone is funded in the budget we are adopting and my mother is an employee of that entity, and that the 10 11 New York City Department of Education is funded in the budget that we are adopting and my sibling is a 12 13 student at that entity. 14 I vote aye on all. 15 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Hanks. 16 COUNCIL MEMBER HANKS: Thank you. I vote 17 aye on all except for M169 and accompanying Reso. 713 18 and Reso. 703 and 704. Aye on all the rest. 19 Thank you for all your hard work. 20 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 21 you. Hudson. COUNCIL MEMBER HUDSON: I'm disclosing on 2.2 23 the record of the Council proceedings that Museum of the City of New York is funded in the budget we are 24 25

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 20 adopting, and my spouse is associated with that 2 3 entity. 4 I'm aye on all. COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Osse. 5 COUNCIL MEMBER OSSE: Permission to 6 explain my vote. 7 8 CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Yes. 9 COUNCIL MEMBER OSSE: I'm voting against 10 this budget for many reasons, but I want to commend the libraries and the cultural institutions for their 11 12 tireless fight in making sure that they received the funding that they deserve. Very proud of the work 13 14 that we've done together in rallying to push back 15 against the Mayor's cuts. We here in this room and 16 the broader Council know how important our libraries 17 and our cultural institutions are to the people of 18 New York City. 19 With that, I vote aye on all except for M141, M142, and M143. Thank you. 20 21 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 2.2 you. Sanchez. 23 COUNCIL MEMBER SANCHEZ: Thank you. I am disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings 24 25 that the City University of New York is funded in the

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 21 budget we are adopting, and my brother is employed by 2 3 that entity. 4 With that, I vote aye. COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Stevens. 5 COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENS: Good afternoon. 6 7 I'm disclosing on the record that the University of New York is funded in this budget we are adopting and 8 9 my daughter is a student at that institution, and Columbia Presbyterian is funded in this budget we are 10 11 adopting and my daughter is an employee of that 12 institution. Although I am really upset that we 13 weren't able to deliver for the human service sector 14 15 with their COLA, the fight will continue, and I vote 16 aye on all. 17 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: 18 Velazquez. 19 COUNCIL MEMBER VELAZQUEZ: Permission to 20 explain my vote. CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Of course. 21 COUNCIL MEMBER VELAZQUEZ: I am disclosing 2.2 23 on the record of the Council proceedings that my spouse is an employee of the Department of 24 25 Environmental Protection, and Samaritans of New York

1 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE 22 is funded in the budget that we're adopting and my 2 3 sibling is a board member of that entity, and that 4 New York City Department of Housing Preservation and 5 Development is funded in the budget we are adopting and my sibling is associated with that entity. 6 7 I vote aye on all. 8 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 9 you. Williams. Won. 10 COUNCIL MEMBER WON: Aye on all. 11 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Carr. 12 COUNCIL MEMBER CARR: I'd like to disclose on the record of the Council proceedings that the 13 14 City University of New York is funded in the budget 15 we are adopting and my spouse is a student at that 16 entity, and the Italian Club of Staten Island and the 17 Jewish Community Center of Staten Island are being 18 funded in the budget we are adopting and I am a 19 member of both of those organizations. 20 I'll make more lengthy thank-yous at 21 Stated but just thank you to all the Staff who worked on this. 2.2 23 I'll be voting no on M169 and accompanying Resolution 713 as well as Reso. 703 and 24 25 704 and aye on the rest. Thank you.

2 COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank 3 you. One moment.

All items have been adopted by a vote of 17 in the affirmative, zero in the negative, and no abstentions with the exceptions of the following items.

M141, M142, and M143 as well as M169 and
Preconsidered Resolution as well as Resolution 703
and 704 were adopted by the Committee with 15 in the
affirmative, 2 in the negative, and zero abstentions.
CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you. Before we
close, I want to congratulate our Chief Economist,
Ray Majewski. This will be his last budget.

Okay, this meeting is adjourned. We'llsee you at Stated in a little while. [GAVEL]
