1 COMMITTEE ON CIVIL SERVICE AND LABOR 2 2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a sound check 3 for the Committee on Civil Service and Labor. Today's date is July 13, 2023, being recorded by Danny Huong 4 5 (phonetic) in the Committee Room. 6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and 7 welcome to today's Committee on Civil Service and 8 Labor. 9 Place all electronic devices to vibrate 10 or silent mode. Thank you for your cooperation. 11 Chair, we are ready to begin. 12 CHAIRPERSON DE LA ROSA: [GAVEL] Good 13 morning and welcome to today's vote of the Civil 14 Service and Labor Committee. 15 I am Council Member Carmen De La Rosa, 16 Chair of the Committee, and today we are voting on 17 the following bill, Intro. 645-B sponsored by Speaker 18 Adams in relation to civil service examinations for 19 justice-involved individuals. 20 Re-entry into the workforce after release 21 from jail is crucial to the stability of formerly 2.2 incarcerated people, their families, and society at 23 large. Research shows that steady employment and 24 reliable income reduces recidivism, thereby 25 increasing public safety. The New York City Council

2	Civil Service Exam system is an entryway into the
3	municipal workforce. Civil service employment offers
4	job security, health, and labor benefits, and long-
5	term promotional career opportunities. In order to
6	qualify for over 80 percent of City Government
7	positions, applicants must pass the exam, which
8	covers a wide range of disciplines such as landscape
9	architects, electricians, sanitation workers. The
10	exam system is intended to ensure fairness and equal
11	opportunity to produce a municipal workforce that
12	reflects the diversity of the City.
13	Intro. 645-B requires DOC and DCAS to
14	facilitate the opportunity to join the civil service
15	by offering exams and exam preparation to those in
16	DOC custody as well as those who have been released
17	within the past year. The bill requires the
18	Commissioners of both agencies to administer the
19	civil service examinations for individuals
20	incarcerated for a period of 10 days or longer in
21	borough-based jails.
22	Additionally, the bill requires DOC to
23	collaborate with DCAS to provide exams, preparation
24	to incarcerated individuals including guided

1 COMMITTEE ON CIVIL SERVICE AND LABOR 4 2 instruction, study materials, practice tests, and 3 civil service employment application counseling. This bill would also authorize DCAS to 4 waive the civil service exam fee for eligible 5 populations. 6 7 Lastly, this bill requires DCAS to issue an annual report on the number of individuals who 8 9 participated in City-provided exams, preparation, or programming. 10 11 This legislation has the potential to make civil service more inclusive of justice-involved 12 13 individuals and help formerly incarcerated individuals secure well-paying jobs that can lead to 14 15 long-term careers. 16 I believe employment is the cornerstone of stable re-entry and facilitating civil service 17 exam administration sets the foundation for success. 18 19 I'd like to thank our Committee Staff for 20 their hard work in preparing for this vote, Policy Analysts Elizabeth Arzt and Rie Ogasawara as well as 21 my Staff, Chief-of-Staff James Burke, Legislative 2.2 23 Director Kiana Diaz, and Comms Director Fray Familia.
