3	the New York City Council Subcommittee on Land Use,
4	Public Sitings and Dispositions. At this time,
5	please place your phone on vibrate or on silent mode.
6	Thank you for your cooperation. Chair, we are ready
7	to begin.
8	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Good morning. I am Council
9	Member Farah Louis, Chair of the Subcommittee on
10	Landmarks, Public Sitings and Dispositions. I am
11	joined today by my colleagues Council Member
12	Schulman, Vernikov, Nurse and Ung. Thank you all for
13	coming.
14	Before we begin with today's agenda, I will
15	recognize the Subcommittee Counsel to explain today's
16	hearing procedures.
17	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Thank you Chair Louis. I am
18	Arthur Huh, Counsel to this Subcommittee. This
19	meeting is being held in a hybrid format. Members of
20	the public who wish to testify may do so in person or
21	via Zoom. Those wishing to testify via Zoom are
22	asked to register online and you may do so now by
23	visiting <pre>www.council.nyc.gov/landuse.</pre>
24	If you have already registered but have not yet
25	signed in to the Zoom, please do so now and remain

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2	signed in until after you have testified. If you
3	have written testimony you would like the
4	Subcommittee to consider in addition to or instead of
5	appearing before the Subcommittee, please send it via

10	Chair Louis will now continue with today's
11	agenda.
12	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Thank you. I will now open
13	the public hearing on Preconsidered Application
14	Number G 230029 SCQ, a site selection submission from
15	the New York City School Construction Authority,
16	pursuant to Section 1732 of the New York City School
17	Construction Authority Act for a new approximately
18	696 seat primary school facility located at 120-08
19	Jamaica Avenue in Queens within Community School
20	District 29, Community District 9, and in Council
21	Member Lynn Schulman's District.
22	Presenting this item on behalf of the SCA will be
23	the Vice President of External Affairs Andrea Bender
24	and Senior Director of Real Estate Kelly Murphy. I
25	will remind anyone wishing to testify remotely, if

Can Council 4 5 Member Schulman - oh should she do that after her statements? Yeah, if you could give your opening 6 7 statement, thank you.

8 COUNCIL MEMBER SCHULMAN: Thank you. Good 9 morning and thank you Chair Louis for the opportunity 10 to make remarks on this proposed project. Today, we 11 will be discussing a proposal that holds great 12 significance for my district and the Richmond Hill community. The establishment of a new elementary 13 school at 120-08 Jamaica Avenue. 14

15 Our children only get one shot at a good 16 education. It is the cornerstone of any thriving 17 community. Through education, we nurture the minds 18 of our youth, preparing them for a future that is yet 19 to be written, therefore, the proposal to construct a 20 new elementary school in our district is of upmost 21 importance to our shared vision of progress and 2.2 opportunity to for all.

In addition, the new school will have a muchneeded D75 component to enable children with special needs to fulfill their potential. At the heart of SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITINGS, AND DISPOSITIONS

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2 this proposal lays the recognition that our existing 3 educational infrastructure is under immense strain. 4 As our community continues to grow and flourish, it is incumbent upon us to ensure that our children have 5 access to high quality education. The construction 6 7 of this new elementary school will alleviate overcrowding in existing schools, allowing for 8 9 smaller class sizes and more personalized detention for our students. 10

11 I want to acknowledge that during the process parents from the Richmond Hill community, along with 12 13 Community Board 9 members very strongly advocated for 14 a middle school in place of the proposed elementary 15 school. In meeting and speaking with these parents, 16 it became clear that their desire for middle school 17 was largely based on the long commutes for many of their kids to the school zone for them. 18

In discussions with the Department of Education, Local School Superintendents and Community Education Council Representatives, an agreement was made for all of us to work together to find creative, strategic ways to alleviate the concerns raised, which include zoning and transportation options.
This proposed school will be equipped with state-of-

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2 the-art facilities, cutting-edge technology and ample 3 spaces for both academic and extracurricular 4 activities. It will foster an environment that 5 encourages curiosity, creativity and critical 6 thinking, empowering our students to become lifelong 7 learners and leaders in their own right.

8 In conclusion, the Proposal for a new elementary 9 school at 120-08 Jamaica Avenue, presents us with an opportunity to enhance educational advancement, 10 11 alleviate overcrowding and provide our children with a nurturing and inspiring learning environment. 12 13 Thank you for your time and attention. Let us move 14 forward together united in our commitment to the 15 future of our kids in our city. Thank you.

16 CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Thank you Council Member 17 Schulman. Counsel, would you please administer the 18 affirmation?

19 COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Would you please raise your 20 right hand and state your name for the record?

21 COMMITTEE COUNSEL: And do you affirm to tell the 22 truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth in 23 your testimony before the Subcommittee and in answer 24 to all Council Member questions?

25 KELLY MURPHY: Yes.

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2	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Thank you.
3	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Thank you. You may begin.
4	Whenever you are ready to have a presentation shown
5	on the screen, please say so and our staff will
6	display it.
7	KELLY MURPHY: Yeah, that would be great if it
8	could go up on the screen.
9	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Thank you.
10	KELLY MURPHY: Good morning Chair Louis and
11	members of the Committee. As you said, I'm Kelly
12	Murphy. I'm the Real Estate at the School
13	Construction Authority and I'm joined by Andrea
14	Bender, our Vice President of External Affairs.
15	We're very pleased to be here to present the proposed
16	site selection for approximately 696-seat Primary
17	School in Richmond Hill.
18	We are especially thankful to Council Member
19	Schulman for her dedicated and diligent support of
20	the project, thank you.
21	Pursuant to Section 1731 of the New York Public
22	State — the New York State Public Authorities Law,
23	the New York City School Construction Authority has
24	undertaken the site selection process for a new
25	approximately 696 Seat Primary School located at 120-

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2	08 Jamaica Avenue, Block 9330, Lots 1, 8, 10, and 12
3	in the Borough of Queens. The site is approximately
4	34,774 square feet about a 0.8 acres and the property
5	contains two vacant buildings, one two story and one
6	four stories and on a parking lot. The site is
7	located within Community Board Number 9 and in
8	Community Education Council Member 27.
9	The purpose of the proposed site plan for new
10	primary schools to provide additional permanent
11	school capacity that has been identified in the DOE's
12	five-year capital plan for 2020-2024. During the
13	2021-2022 school year, Community Education Council's
14	Elementary Schools operated collectively at 103
15	percent of their targeted capacity.
16	So, if you can go to the next slide please. So,
17	this is just an overview. It gives you the location
18	and the red bullseyes kind of in the middle of the
19	site and you can see the Long Island Railroad Tracks
20	kind of run Southeast of the site.
21	The next slide please. This is just showing the
22	exact block and lots that are the subject of the site
23	selection. Next slide please.
24	And this is more of a blown-up view. You could
25	see on Jamaica Avenue; you could see the L and the

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2	two buildings in the parking lot of the site. Next
3	slide please. This is our official notice of filing,
4	which I need to read into the record.
5	This is a notice of filing for the site plan. It
6	was published in AM New York and the City Record on
7	January 17, 2023, at which time Community Education
8	Council Number 27, Queens Community Board Number 9,
9	and City Planning Commission were also notified along
10	with elected officials. Community Education Council
11	Number 27 held a public hearing on January 30, 2023
12	and Queens Community Board Number 9 held a public
13	hearing on February 13, 2023.
14	All public comments received on the site were
15	considered as part of the site selection process.
16	The FCA affirms the site plan pursuant to 1731 of the
17	New York Public Authorities Law and in accordance
18	with Section 1732 of the PIL. The SCA submitted the
19	proposed site plan to the Mayor and City Council in a
20	letter dated July 18, 2023.
21	Next slide please. So, this next three slides is
22	just kind of more photographs of the site. So, this
23	is the first two story building on the left with the
24	red and you could see the entrance to the J&Z line is

literally right in front of the school. Next slide.

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You can see the L on these pictures and then the four-story industrial building that's on the site. Next slide. And then just more pictures of the site and the parking lot and the building that will be demolished in order to accommodate construction of the site.

Should the FCA receive approval to acquire the 8 9 property, the existing buildings will be demolished in order to construct the new primary school. 10 It's 11 anticipated that school will open in 2027 and will 12 include classrooms for prekindergarten to grade five. 13 As the Council Member said, District 75 classrooms, 14 music and art classrooms, a science resource room, a 15 library reading and speech resource rooms, kitchen cafeteria, administrative space, medical suite and 16 17 play yard.

We look forward to the Subcommittee's favorable consideration of the Proposed Site Plan and we're pleased to answer any questions you may have. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: I just want to share we've been joined by Council Member De La Rosa. Thank you for your presentation. I'd like to now recognize Council Member Schulman if you have any questions.

SUBCOMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC 1 SITINGS, AND DISPOSITIONS 12 2 COUNCIL MEMBER SCHULMAN: No, none at this time. 3 CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Do any of our colleagues have 4 questions? Great. If there are no further 5 questions, the applicant panel is excused. Counsel, are there any members of the public wishing to 6 7 testify? COMMITTEE COUNSEL: A reminder for anyone with us 8 9 here today in the room who would like to testify on

10 this item, please see the Sergeant to complete a 11 speaker card. And I will just confirm Madam Chair 12 that there's no one registered remotely. It appears 13 we have no one signed up to testify in the room. 14 Okay, and we're not seeing any online witnesses 15 either.

16 CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Being there are no members of 17 the public who wish to testify regarding 18 Preconsidered Application G 2300029 SCQ, the public 19 hearing is now closed.

20 Next, we will vote on the Application we just 21 heard but before we vote, I'd like to take this time 22 again to recognize any of my colleagues who may have 23 questions or remarks regarding this item we heard 24 today, which again has the support of Council Member

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2	Schulman. Going once, going twice, great. I now
3	call for a vote to approve.
4	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: To approve Preconsidered
5	Application Number G 230029 SCQ. Chair Louis?
6	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: I vote aye. Congratulations.
7	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Council Member De La Rosa?
8	COUNCIL MEMBER DE LA ROSA: Aye.
9	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Council Member Nurse?
10	COUNCIL MEMBER NURSE: Aye.
11	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Council Member Ung?
12	COUNCIL MEMBER UNG: Aye.
13	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Council Member Vernikov?
14	COUNCIL MEMBER VERNIKOV: I vote aye.
15	Congratulations.
16	COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Okay, the vote is currently
17	five in the affirmative, zero in the negative and no
18	abstentions. The item is adopted and will be
19	recommended to the full Land Use Committee.
20	CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: Again, congratulations to
21	all. That concludes today's business. I would like
22	to thank the members of the public, my colleagues,
23	Subcommittee Counsel, Land Use Staff and Sergeant at
24	Arms for your participation today. This meeting is
25	hereby adjourned. [GAVEL].
