Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON ARIOLA: Good morning. My name is Joann Ariola, and I am the Chair of the Fire and Emergency Management Committee.

Today, we're voting on Preconsidered

Introduction number T20234047 that will be introduced
by Council Member Gale Brewer at today's Stated

Meeting of which I am a prime co-sponsor along with
my fellow Committee Members, Council Members Holden,

Yeger, Schulman, Carr, and Kagan. This bill would

create a one-time exception to the maximum age

requirement for membership in the Fire Department for

certain persons during the next promotional exam

period.

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Before moving forward, I would like to acknowledge the Members of the Fire and Emergency Management Committee who are here today. Council Members Riley, Schulman, Kagan, Carr, Holden, and, of course, Council Member Gennaro who is joining us via Zoom. I would also like to thank Council Member Brewer for joining us today to make a statement on her bill.

Before I turn the microphone over to Council Member Brewer for her statement, I would like to make brief remarks on the legislation. During our past hearings on the topic of New York City's promotional exam, we received testimony from many hard-working EMTs and paramedics who delivered passionate testimonials describing their immense desire to become New York City firefighters but had been unfairly disqualified due to administrative delays during the COVID-19 pandemic. Their testimony was both inspiring and humbling and once again showed how vital they are to the safety and well-being of all New Yorkers. Today, by passing this bill, we correct what has been an injustice to hard-working EMS personnel who seek to take the promotional exam to become New York City firefighters. We are at the

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very least giving them a fair opportunity to serve
our city in that capacity.

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I want to thank Committee Staff, Josh
Kingsley and William Hongach for their very hard work
on this legislation, Deputy Director of the City
Council's Government Affairs, Rachel Cordero for
spearheading this issue as well as the
Administration's work in partnership.

I will now pass the microphone over to Council Member Brewer for her opening remarks.

much, Council Member Ariola, and I also want to thank the many, as our Chair just did, individuals who testified at her hearing. They were incredibly articulate, both father and son in one situation, and just the dynamic way in which they have approached this issue just shows the strength of their participation as EMTs and hopefully firefighters so I'm really honored to be participating as a sponsor of this legislation with the amazing Chair of the Fire Committee and the other co-sponsors to create, as you heard, a one-time waiver from existing age requirements for becoming an FDNY firefighter. This is for EMS workers who would have otherwise been able

COMMITTEE ON FIRE AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT 5 to take the promotional exam had it been given at its usual frequency but for delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We all know that the firefighters and the EMS workers are some of the bravest and most dedicated public servants in our city, and I said earlier the articulateness and the presence that they demonstrated at the hearing is an example. Obviously, in their professional lives, they put their lives on the line every day to protect all of us and, during COVID, they continued to be on the frontline, sacrificing their health and the health of their loved ones to keep doing the job. We owe them a debt of gratitude and we owe them this exam. This legislation is a way to show our appreciation for their service and to give these heroes a fair chance to compete for promotions in the Fire Department. They have the skills from EMS and they have the experience from EMS to be successful firefighters, and they should not be barred from taking the promotional exam, I think around 300 people or more, simply because they are over the current maximum age and COVID prevented the City from administering the exam in 2020. I recognize that this one-time exemption will not cover everyone who wants to take

2	the exam, although I want to thank the Chair and the
3	Speaker's Office and the Administration for working
4	out some of the details so more than were originally
5	thought to take it can take it, and I'm confident
6	that we have maximized an opportunity that is
7	consistent with the applicable law. This is so much
8	the right thing to do.
9	Again, thank you, Chair Ariola, all the
10	Committee Staff that you mentioned, and certainly
11	Cynthia Hornig from my office. This is a really
12	important day today. Thank you.
