22	and vote on Proposed Resolution 415-A sponsored by
23	Council Member Joann Ariola, a resolution calling on
24	the United States Congress to pass and the President
25	to sign the September 11th Day of Remembrance Act,

and we will also vote on Proposed Resolution 346-A 2 3 sponsored by Nantasha Williams, a resolution 4 recognizing the contributions of hip-hop to arts and culture by designating August 11th as Hip-Hop 5 Celebration Day, August as Hip-Hop Recognition Month, 6 and November as Hip-Hop History Month in the City of 7 8 New York. Proposed Resolution 450-A also sponsored by 9 Council Member Williams, a resolution recognizing the contributions of Def Jam to the music industry and to 10 11 music lovers everywhere by designating January 2024 as Def Jam Recognition Month in the City of New York. 12

Last month, we celebrated the 50th 13 anniversary of hip-hop, a genre that made waves on 14 15 our culture. Hip-hop was founded in the Bronx by black artists, poets, and musicians as a form of 16 17 expression and creativity to address injustices and 18 bring resilience and power in the midst of it while 19 centering joy, love, community, and celebration, the 20 tenets that our city is built upon. Tenets that bring 21 our city together and make it what it is.

This week marks the 22nd anniversary of the September 11th attacks. The attacks cut us deeply. Thousands were murdered, both as workers at the World Trade Center and as the brave first COMMITTEE ON CULTURAL AFFAIRS, LIBRARIES AND INTERNATIONAL INTERGROUP RELATIONS

responders who rushed to their rescue. We will always 2 3 remember them. In the years since, chronic illness 4 took more lives and left many with permanent disabilities. At the same time, xenophobia spiked as 5 far too many people chose to direct their anger at 6 7 racial and religious minorities. This is a legacy we continue to fight. While it can be explained, it 8 9 cannot be excused.

On a personal note, I would like to take 10 a moment to remember one of those heroic first 11 12 responders, retired NYPD officer Robert Anthony 13 Nobile. Bob died last week after suffering for many years from cancer that resulted from his days at 14 15 Ground Zero. He was a wonderful guy, devoted husband to Liz, and loving father to Samantha and Rob. He 16 17 will be missed every day.

I want to recognize Members of this

Member Louis, and Council Member Dinowitz, and online
we have Council Members Hanif and Moya.
