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SERGEANT WONG: Sound check for the Committee on Immigration. Today's date is October 19, 2023 being recorded by Danny Huang in the Committee Room.

SERGEANT AT ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to the Committee on Immigration. Please place all electronic devices to vibrate or silent mode.

Chair Hanif, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON HANIF: Good morning, and thank you for attending today's vote of the Committee on Immigration. We will be voting on proposed Introduction 1084-A, sponsored by Council Member Mercedes Narcisse, in relation to creating training on trauma-informed care for persons serving refugees, asylees, asylum seekers, and migrants.

We will also be voting on proposed Resolution 459-A, sponsored by Council Member Amanda Farías, regarding the federal electronic verification system known as E-Verify.

I want to thank my Council colleagues for joining us here today.

New York City has been welcoming immigrants for its entire history, and has received tens of thousands of asylum seekers and migrants since April of last year. This council has sought to welcome our

newest New Yorkers with compassion, dignity, and care. Many individuals arriving in New York have undergone harrowing circumstances in their countries of origin and on their journeys to the United States traversing dangerous terrain on foot while fleeing persecution and other forms of adversity. New York City service providers must be prepared to serve individuals who have experienced trauma.

Proposed Introduction Number 1084-A will address this need. This bill would require The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene [DOHMH] to include in its training on trauma-informed care appropriate information on refugee, asylee, asylum seeker, and migrant experiences. The bill would also require DOHMH to determine who of those serving refugees, asylees, asylum seekers, and migrants should be offered the training and offer it them.

The bill will require city agencies to offer initial and ongoing training to all providers who regularly engage with asylum seekers on recognizing signs of trauma exposure; understanding common behaviors of people exposed to trauma; and applying trauma-informed principles for interacting.

I am grateful to Council Member Narcisse for sponsoring this critical legislation. As we continue to welcome new neighbors in our city, we have endeavored to help tens of thousands of asylum seekers who are escaping not only persecution but also economic collapse. As they have done for centuries, people are coming to New York City to peruse a better life for themselves and their families.

Unfortunately, the E-Verify requirement needlessly interferes with workers' ability to realize their American dream. Proposed Resolution 459-A, calls upon the New York State Legislature to pass, and the Governor to sign, A.568/S.1802 prohibiting municipalities from requiring all employers to check prospective employees' work authorization status by using the federal electronic verification system and prohibiting employers from checking the employment authorization status of an existing employee or an applicant who has not been offered employment. I thank Council Member Farías for sponsoring this important resolution.

I look forward to the vote on this legislation today, and I look forward to the support these bills would provide our newest New Yorkers.

I would like to acknowledge that we have been joined by Council Member Krishnan, Council Member Ung, Council Member Carmen De La Rosa, Council Member Narcisse, Council Member Moya, and Council Member Sanchez on Zoom.

I will now turn it over to Council Member Narcisse to provide a statement on her bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER NARCISSE: Good morning, I would like thank Chair Hanif and the members of the Committee on Immigration for considering Introduction 1084-A.

Introduction 1084-A holds the promise of fostering a more inclusive and emphatic New York City for those who have sought refuge and asylum within our borders. This legislation signifies our

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commitment to provide essential training in traumainformed care for individuals serving refuges,
asylees, asylum seekers, and migrants.

I just cannot imagine folks walking on their feet for miles, being traumatized all along the way, and when they reach here we cannot provide the best quality care for them and offer them an opportunity to get on their feet.

This bill is recognizing that those who have faced adversity deserve not only our protection but also our understanding and support. No matter what one's feelings may be on the border issue and the complex challenges of housing migrants, we can all agree that the humanitarian thing to do is to ensure basic health care needs are met for these individuals.

This bill aligns with our shared values of compassion and empathy. I urge committee members to consider the profound impact this bill can have on the lives of those who have experienced trauma. By equipping service providers with the knowledge and the tools to offer compassionate care, we are taking a significant step toward building a more resilient, caring, and united city.

I would like to express my gratitude to all of the wonderful staff who worked on this bill with us and most importantly, Saye Joseph, my Chief of Staff and Legislative & Budget Director.

This bill is very important, not only because I am a nurse, but because I learned to care by coming from Haiti to this land. I thank God for our opportunities. This is what we do in New York City, we care for each other.

So, I want to say thank you in advance to all of my colleagues. As a health care professional, I get to work in my community, and I see firsthand how someone's mental health can be devastating, not just to the person themselves, but to all of their neighbors, their friends, and their families. like I said yesterday, we cannot be pennywise and dollar foolish. When those folks come here, they are looking for opportunities. So, let's be the caring city that we should be.

Thank you, Chair. Together we can create a safer and more compassionate New York City at large, so thank you.
