CHAIRPERSON GENNARO: Thank you, Sergeant.

[GAVEL] Good morning. I am Jim Gennaro, Chair of the

Committee on Environmental Protection, Resiliency and

Waterfronts.

Today, we'll be voting on Proposed Intro.

102-A sponsored by Council Member Brannan which would require the Department of Environmental Protection to include information about the location of green roofs in an online map published by the Department. It would also require the Department to include certain information about each green roof including the type of building it is located, the area of the roof and the area covered by the green roof system, the capacity of the green roof to absorb water, and other

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function or functions of the green roof. We first considered this bill on February 3, 2023.

Green roofs are an important tool in our City's effort to increase climate resiliency. They cool ambient temperatures which protects New Yorkers from severe heat brought by climate change. Green roofs also prevent contaminants from entering our City's waterways by reducing the volume of combined sewer overflows or CSOs. Every year, CSOs cause more than 20 billion dollars of raw sewage and stormwater runoff to enter the City's waterways. I will mention that there's been probably like a 90 percent decrease in CSO runoff in the last decade or so so great strides have been made, we can always do better, 20 billion gallons is a lot of water, a lot of sewage. Green roofs reduce the volume of CSOs by storing rainfall which increases the effective capacity of the City's wastewater infrastructure. A comprehensive online map of green roof systems as required by this bill could help the City conducted targeted outreach to buildings that lack a green roof but may be a good candidate for one, thus helping build a more resilient city. That was the key paragraph right there. That was the good one.
