Every New Yorker deserves safe streets, and every New Yorker deserves access to the infrastructure necessary to travel the city safely and efficiently, but it's not enough to just build infrastructure. We have to build where it's needed. The Department of Transportation has taken steps to consider equity in their investment decisions, but we can do more. We can be more transparent, we can be more equitable, and we can enshrine safeguards in law such that New Yorkers in forgotten and neglected communities are no longer overlooked. The bill I am proposing today would require the Department of Transportation to promote equity as a part of its Streets Plan and require DOT to identify underserved neighborhoods in need of additional infrastructure
