CHAIRPERSON BROOKS-POWERS: [GAVEL] Good morning and welcome to this hearing of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. I am Selvena Brooks-Powers, Chair to the Committee.

Today, we will be voting on three pieces of legislation, Intro. number 816 sponsored by

Council Member Lincoln Restler in relation to suspending alternate side parking regulations on

Tisha B'Av and Intro. number 1191 sponsored by myself in relation to taxicab license durations, and Intro.

1192, also sponsored by myself, in relation to authorizing physician assistants and nurse practitioners to conduct medical exams of taxi driver's license applicants.

Equity is always at the forefront of this Committee's work. Suspending alternate side of the street parking on Tisha B'Av brings the city one step closer to ensuring that the DOT's list of legal and religious holidays is equitable and fair. Moreover,

Intros 1191 and 1192 would make TLC more efficient and help drivers by changing the duration of taxicab licenses from one year to two years and allowing applicants for a taxi driver's license to obtain medical clearance from a physician assistant or nurse practitioner. Nurse practitioners and physician assistants are trained and licensed to conduct medical examinations. Allowing TLC driver applicants to obtain exams from these professionals will remove a layer of red tape and expedite the driver's licensing process.

I look forward to voting on these bills. I will now allow Council Member Restler to speak on his bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER RESTLER: Thank you so much, Chair Brooks-Powers, for your support and, Speaker Adams, for her support.

Tisha B'Av is one of the most mournful and tragic days in the Jewish calendar and, for observant Jews, they are at shul from early in the morning until late at night. They fast. They are unable to worry about moving their car, and I really
